ACTIVE INCIDENT

- Conduct AmRRON Nets according to the Emergency Net Schedule. Make appropriate adjustments.
- Act as Net Control if you do not hear a net starting in your area
- All with transmitting capabilities must transmit even if you think no one is listening and you cannot hear them. Relay any information that you have, as if someone is relying on it.
- All Hams/Relays monitor all bands according to schedule
- CH3 Operators check in to local nets when prompted

**Incident
IMMINENT**

- Conduct nets on daily/weekly basis (as situation requires)
- Monitor radio, news, ARES/RACES, internet, etc.
- Share information with network so all are informed
- Prepare all equipment for operation or evacuation
- Review radio operations with family/group
- Provide SPOT Reports on interagency activities when applicable

Incident Probable

- Finalize plans with family/friends/Network for 'what-if'
- Monitor radio traffic & increase frequency of nets
- Maintenance/Checks on fuel, back-up power, batteries, etc.
- Review comm plan and email/phone network to adjust the comm plan. Decide on frequency/mode for situation.

Incident Possible

- Possible near-future interruption in conventional comms
- Inventory, locate, and assemble all comm equipment.
- Increase monitoring of situational developments (News)
- Make phone & email contacts to keep everyone in your network informed.
- Continue with regularly-scheduled nets

5

No Incident

- Conduct Regularly-scheduled Nets 1st & 3rd Week – monthly
- Monitor radio frequencies and maintain proficiency
- Check into local/regional ham nets, or monitor if unlicensed
- Develop and expand current nets and training sessions
