

CHAPTER CII.

[H. B. No. 124.]

RELATING TO SERVICE OF PROCESS ISSUED BY JUSTICES OF THE PEACE.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to amend section[s] 1456 and 1457 of the Code of Procedure of the State of Washington, relating to the issuing, service and return of process issued by justices of the peace, and to provide for the service and return of summons and complaint and notice issued by justices of the peace by persons other than sheriffs and constables."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That section one of an act entitled "An act to amend section[s] 1456 and 1457 of the Code of Procedure of the State of Washington, relating to the issuance, service and return of process and the complaint and notice issued by justices of the peace, and to provide for the service and return of summons and of complaint and notice issued by justices of the peace by persons other than sheriffs and constables," approved March 10, 1893, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: Sec. 1. All process issued by justices of the peace shall run in the name of the State of Washington, be dated the day issued, signed by the justice granting the same, and be directed to the sheriff or any constable of the proper county, and the same, as also the complaint and notice, shall be served by one of said officers.

SEC. 2. That section two of the act above described be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: Sec. 2. Every constable or sheriff serving any process or complaint and notice, shall return thereon in writing the time, manner and place of service, and endorse thereon the legal fees therefor, and shall sign his name to such return.
