

CHAPTER 121.

ABANDONED STATE HIGHWAY.

An Act authorizing and directing the Governor to reconvey to C. L. Peters and Mary S. Peters, his wife, a certain strip of land as a part of the proposed location of the Olympic Highway, which location was afterwards abandoned.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That the Governor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to in the name of the State of Washington, convey by quitclaim deed to C. L. Peters and Mary S. Peters, his wife, the following described tract of land in Grays Harbor county, Washington, said premises having heretofore been acquired by the state as a part of the proposed location of the Olympic Highway, which said proposed location was afterwards abandoned:

A strip of land 60 feet wide, being 30 feet on either side of the center line of said road as surveyed, over and across Tract 4 of First Addition to Humptulips Gardens; center line of said strip being described as follows: Beginning at a point 14½ feet west of Station 1+34 of survey for change of Olympic Highway, a point on north line of Tract 4 of First Addition to Humptulips Gardens; thence S. 36°31' E. to a point 26 feet east of Station 7+32 of survey, said point being a point on west line of present Olympic Highway and on north line of tract owned by School District No. 46, in section 4, Twp. 18 N. R. 11 W. W. M.
