

CHAPTER CLX.

[S. B. No. 163.]

FOR THE PROTECTION OF SEED BUYERS.

AN ACT to protect seed buyers in the State of Washington.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington :

SECTION 1. That any person or persons doing business in this state who shall knowingly sell seed, or offer for sale any vegetable seed that are not plainly marked upon each package or bag containing such seed the year in which said seed were grown, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than fifty dollars, or imprisoned not more than thirty days for each and every offense.

SEC. 2. That any person or persons who shall, with intention to deceive, wrongly mark or label, as to date, any package or bag containing garden or vegetable seed shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars, or imprisoned not less than ten nor more than thirty days.

SEC. 3. That this act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of January, 1902.
