

CHAPTER 26.

PROVIDING FOR AN ASSISTANT HIGHWAY
COMMISSIONER.

AN ACT providing for the appointment and qualification of an assistant highway commissioner.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That the highway commissioner may appoint an assistant who shall act as chief clerk in his office, and such assistant shall have power to perform any act or duty relating to the office of highway commissioner that the commissioner has, and, in case of vacancy by death or resignation of the highway commissioner, said assistant shall perform the duties of said office until the vacancy is filled. Such assistant shall subscribe, take and file the oath of office provided by law for other state officers before entering upon the performance of his duties. The principal shall be responsible under his official bond for all of the official acts of the assistant, and may revoke such appointment at his pleasure, and may require his assistant to give him a bond in such sum as the principal may determine, which bond shall be made, executed, approved and filed as other state official bonds.

GRANTING CERTAIN TIDE LANDS TO PORT OF GRAYS

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. There is hereby granted to the Port of Grays Harbor, a port district co-extensive with the
