CHAPTER 2. [S. B. 41.]

APPROPRIATION—EXPENSES OF LEGISLATURE.

An Act relating to the expenses of the thirty-sixth legislature; making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of Appropriation. the state general fund the sum of three hundred eighty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of paying the expenses, except legislative printing, of the thirty-sixth legislature. From the amount hereby appropriated:

- (1) The Senate shall not expend more than one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars; and
- (2) The House of Representatives shall not expend more than two hundred five thousand dollars.

SEC. 2. None of the funds appropriated herein Interim shall be expended by or for the legislative council, exclusion. the legislative budget committee or any other legislative interim committee.

APPROPRIATION—LEGISLATIVE PRINTING.

An Act relating to legislative printing; making an appropriation; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Appropriation.

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the general fund the sum of ninety thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to pay for such printing as may be ordered by the thirty-sixth legislature, or either branch thereof.
