


Report requirements

RCW 46.18.060 requires the Department of Licensing to:

- **Review and approve the annual financial reports submitted by sponsoring organizations with active special license plate series and present those annual financial reports to the Joint Transportation Committee**
- **Report annually to the Joint Transportation Committee on the special license plate applications that were considered by DOL**

Report covers previous calendar or fiscal year, depending on how organizations are required to report.



Overview

- About 100,000 special plates currently registered
- Special design plates are up to \$45 in addition to other licensing fees
- Top-three:
 - Washington State University (18,138)
 - Law Enforcement Memorial (9,680)
 - Univ. of Washington (7,659)



2012 Revenue highlights

Armed Forces plates combined: \$387,327

Law Enforcement Memorial: \$263,465

Washington Wildlife plates combined: \$213,390
