




115 program completers




**80 %** of former interns are interested in working for SEH.

90 hour internships are available to Evergreen Public Schools juniors and seniors.


SEH Interns represent all four Evergreen School District high schools





*"If I hadn't done the internship, I would have just gone home after school. But instead I got to come to SEH. I got to be a part of something bigger than myself,"* reflected

**Valeriy Gershun**, who interned his junior year at Evergreen High School. Now working at SEH, Valeriy is one of five former interns who came back to work full-time in production in June 2013 on the Monday after they graduated from high school. "Working is different than being an intern, because you are responsible for running machines, and you interact with the wafers" he says. "However, having done the internship helped me in my first few days because I already knew my supervisor, and understood what we do here. It also helped me learn communication skills. My internship was the first time in my life that I worked in a team with people older than me. I really learned how important it is to ask questions when I don't understand something. I also learned how important it is for me to complete my part of the project—because it impacts other people if I don't".

**Yuliya Nikiforets'** internship, which she did as a senior at Evergreen High School, helped her find her career path. The exposure to engineering made her realize that being an engineer was something she could do. *"I thought that mechanical engineering was only for geniuses, but when I saw its application at SEH, I knew it was something I could attain."* Currently, Yuliya works at SEH part time and attends Washington State University, Vancouver. Between her SEH job and scholarships, tuition is covered. Upon graduation, she hopes to continue working at SEH as an engineer.
