Subject: RE: JLTF on the HVAC/R Industry - Request for Recommendations

I have 2 concerns (additions) :

1. Refrigeration systems are defined in the bill to include secondary coolants--which means that chilled water loop piping, fabricating, etc would be included in the scope of this legislation. Chilled water piping, fabricating, etc needs to be exempted from this bill. The best way to deal with this is to change the definition.
2. The bill would require fitters & welders installing, fabricating, etc industrial refrigeration (ammonia) systems to have a license. This is a major problem that must be addressed. Fitters and welders shouldn't be required to have a license, but should be supervised by a licensed person.
