Dear members of the Select Committee on Pension Policy, Please support a Plan 1 COLA for 2024 and an annual permanent COLA and recommend these actions to the 2024 Washington State Legislature. I am a retired Plan 1 teacher from the Shoreline School District with 30 years of teaching. Majority female Plan 1 teachers are the only state retirement plan out of 13 without an annual COLA! I am 75 years old and a full-time care-partner for my husband who has Parkinson's disease, type 2 diabetes, and a heart pacemaker and 3 stents. Our health care costs are increasing but with no annual COLA we are even further behind than last year! I would also appreciate the COLA cap to be raised. The past few increases have been limited to \$62.50 per month and \$110. per month. This number has been tied to senior property tax levels which have also increased due to inflation. Increasing the COLA cap to \$125 per month would be appropriate for this year, and future adjusting the COLA to the cost-of-living like Social Security would be even more helpful to Plan1 seniors long term.
