

List of Bills for Consideration of Recommendation:

Item	Sponsor	Bill Title	Brief Description
3A	Dammeier	Extending the age for service in the Washington State Guard (H-3075.1/12)	The bill authorizes the Adjutant General to extend the service age upon request by an active member of the Washington State Guard. The member requesting the extension must satisfactorily complete physical and mental requirements and live in an area where there is a specific military need for state guard services. Extensions are for a period of one year and may be renewed.
3B	Ormsby	Establishing National Korean War Veterans Armistice Day (H-3056.2/12)	Recognizes National Korean War Veterans Armistice Day as July 27; requires the POW/MIA flag be displayed on this day; and includes the date of the POW/MIA recognition day as the third Friday in September.
3C	Zeiger	Recognizing distinguished military service through the creation of certain military service award special license plates (H-2989.2/11)	A person who has been awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, Silver Star medal, or Bronze Star medal may apply to the Department of Licensing for a special license plate for use on a motor vehicle. The applicant must be the registered owner of the vehicle displaying the plates, and must provide a copy of the armed forces document showing that the recipient was awarded the applicable medal, or the DD-214 or discharge papers if the applicant is a veteran.
3D	McCune	Allowing for a veteran designation on driver's licenses and identicards (Draft)	Allows for drivers' licenses and identicards to include a designation for veteran. In order for a person to have this designation on his or her license or identicard, he or she must provide to the Department of Licensing his or her discharge document. The document must show a discharge status of "honorable" or "general under honorable conditions."
3E	McCune	Providing a sales and use tax exemption for mobility enhancing equipment used by disabled veterans in vehicle adaptations (H-3073.1/12)	Vehicles registered to disabled veterans that contain mobility enhancing equipment are exempt from retail sales tax. Charges for labor and services rendered for repair, cleaning, altering, or improving of mobility enhanced equipment on such vehicles are also exempt from sales tax.

3F	Bailey	Access to state recreation lands by disabled veterans (H-2969.1/11)	Entitles any person who is provided with a lifetime veteran's disability pass from the State Parks and Recreation Commission to a Discover Pass. A Discover Pass is required for any motor vehicle to be parked or operated on any recreation site or lands. Waives the penalty for failure to have or display a Discover Pass if the individual has a lifetime veteran's disability pass from the State Parks and Recreation Commission, or is eligible for such a pass.
3G	Kilmer	Expedited licensing procedures for military spouses (S-3311.1)	Adds a new section to RCW 18 Businesses and Professions: Requires each professional licensing board to establish procedures to expedite the issuance of a license, certificate, or permit to perform professional services regulated by each board to a person certified or licensed in another state to perform professional services in that state; a military spouse transferred to Washington.
3H	Carrell	Veteran's preference for the purpose of public employment (S-3218.2/12)	Provides the same preferences in employment, and layoff and re-employment for veterans receiving military retirement as for other veterans. Adds a provision that scoring criteria status may be claimed upon receipt of separation orders issued by the military if the orders indicate an honorable discharge.
