SSB 5051 CONCERNING NONDEFAULT OR EARLY TERMINATION PROVISIONS IN STATE LAND LEASES FOR AGRICULTURAL OR GRAZING PURPOSES

Prime Sponsor: Senator Brown

C 56 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to provide at least 180 days advance written notice and include written documentation demonstrating that the leased land in a plan for higher and better use, land exchange, or sale in any non-default or early termination provision is included in an agricultural or grazing state land lease.
- Establishes the DNR is not required to include a non-default or early termination provision in an agricultural or grazing state land lease.
- Provides that the DNR is not prohibited from allowing the lessee to surrender the leasehold subject to terms in the lease or including other lease provisions designed to protect the interests of the lessee in the event that the lease is terminated under a non-default or early termination provision.

SB 5075 CONCERNING DISPUTE RESOLUTION BETWEEN SEED BUYERS AND DEALERS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Takko

(HB 1132 Representative Buys)

C 33 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires seed buyers to seek mediation before seeking a legal action to remedy damages in excess of \$5,000.
- Establishes a process for mediation between a seed buyer and seller.
- Repeals provisions related to arbitration.

SSB 5196 INCLUDING CATTLE FEEDLOTS IMPLEMENTING BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES WITHIN THE STATUTORY EXEMPTION FOR ODOR OR FUGITIVE DUST CAUSED BY AGRICULTURAL ACTIVITY

Prime Sponsor: Senator Warnick

(HB 1299 Representative Blake)

C 217 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires any notice of violation pertaining to odors or fugitive dust caused by agricultural activity include a detailed statement with evidence.
- Establishes that the exemption for fugitive dust under the Washington Clean Air Act applies to cattle feedlots implementing good agricultural practices.
- Requires cattle feedlots to comply with applicable requirements included in the approved State Implementation Plan and provides that additional control measures may be required for cattle feedlots if an area in which a cattle feedlot is located is at any time in the future designated nonattainment for a national ambient air quality standard for particulate matter.
- Defines good agricultural practices for cattle feedlots to mean implementing best management practices pursuant to a fugitive dust control plan that meets certain guidelines.

SB 5331 CONCERNING IRRIGATION DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION

Prime Sponsor: Senator Takko

C 321 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Modifies provisions relating to the administration of irrigation districts (districts) by establishing that tolls and charges are not subject to the requirement that assessments be in proportion to the benefits to the land.
- Authorizes districts to approve the sale or transfer of real property owned by the district if certain conditions exist or to waive payments or deposits required as part of an annexation.

SB 5437 CONCERNING THE WEIGHMASTER PROGRAM

Prime Sponsor: Senator Chase

C 158 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires an application for a weighmaster's license to include certain additional information and be accompanied by \$80 for each scale from which certified weights will be issued.
- Removes certain information currently required on an application for an employee of a weighmaster and requires the application be accompanied by a fee of \$20.
- Requires a weight ticket to contain certain information and a certification of weights to be placed in an appropriate and conspicuous place on the certificate.
- Establishes a civil penalty for violations of the weighmaster statutes or rules, and increases monetary penalties for falsely altering or writing a weight ticket, scale ticket, or weight certificate.

ESSB 5808 CONCERNING AGRITOURISM

Prime Sponsor: Senator Warnick

C 227 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Establishes that an agritourism professional is not liable for unintentional injuries, loss, damage, or death suffered by a participant resulting exclusively from any of the inherent risks in agritourism activities.
- Requires an agritourism professional to post and maintain signs that contain a warning notice in order to invoke the privilege of immunity.
- Provides that the liability of an agritourism professional is not limited under certain circumstances.

SHB 1183 AUTHORIZING SPECIFIED LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO DESIGNATE A PORTION OF THEIR TERRITORY AS A CREATIVE DISTRICT SUBJECT TO CERTIFICATION BY THE WASHINGTON STATE ARTS COMMISSION

Prime Sponsor: Representative McBride

(SB 5300 Senator Zeiger)

C 240 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes the Washington State Arts Commission to certify creative districts designated by local governments or federally recognized tribes as areas that promote cultural facilities, creative industries, or arts-related businesses.

ESHB 1296 CONSOLIDATING AND SIMPLIFYING THE ANNUAL REPORT AND ANNUAL SURVEY USED FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TAX INCENTIVES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Nealey

*C 135 L 17 Effective date 1/1/2018**.*

- Consolidates the Annual Report and Annual Survey required of economic development-related tax preferences into one report, called the Annual Tax Performance Report.

SHB 1462 ADDING AUTHORITY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO REGULATE SANITARY PROCESSING OF MARIJUANA-INFUSED EDIBLES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Kloba

(SB 5324 Senator Takko)

C 138 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.*

- Authorizes the Department of Agriculture to regulate sanitary processing of marijuana-infused edibles.
- Requires a marijuana processor that processes, packages, or makes marijuana-infused edibles to obtain an annual marijuana-infused edible endorsement.

SHB 1747 CONCERNING THE WITHDRAWAL OF LAND FROM A DESIGNATED CLASSIFICATION

Prime Sponsor: Representative Taylor

C 251 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Eliminates the requirement that property owners must give a two-year notice to withdraw land from the current use program, if the property has been classified as current use for at least ten years.

EHB 2073 CONCERNING THE BEEF COMMISSION

Prime Sponsor: Representative Dent

C 256 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Establishes that the focus of the Washington State Beef Commission (Beef Commission) includes promoting the beef industry; engaging in health and safety research and education; providing support to the industry; and maintaining efforts to increase beef consumption.
- Requires the Beef Commission to provide programs to support the sustainable stewardship of cattle and the environment, and also the care and well-being of cattle.
- Requires the Beef Commission to prepare a detailed and explanatory budget and submit to the Legislature a report of its activities and expenditures at the end of each fiscal year.

SB 5125 DEFINING INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR RELATIONSHIPS IN THE CONTEXT OF REAL ESTATE LICENSING

Prime Sponsor: Senator Braun

(HB 1137 Representative Kirby)

C 59 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Defines "independent contractor relationship" for the purposes of real estate license law.

**SB 5130 INCREASING MARIJUANA LICENSE FEES AND ADDING A TEMPORARY ADDITIONAL FEE ON
MARIJUANA LICENSES ISSUED BY THE WASHINGTON STATE LIQUOR AND CANNABIS BOARD**

Prime Sponsor: Senator Rivers

(EHB 1858 Representative Sawyer)

C 316 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.*

- Raises the Liquor and Cannabis Board (LCB) licensing and renewal fee for marijuana producers, processors, retailers, and researchers to \$1,300.
- Authorizes a one-time nonrefundable additional fee of \$480 imposed on all marijuana license applications and renewals.
- Requires the LCB to use the revenue from the one-time fee to replace the LCB's current electronic traceability system.

ESSB 5131 CONCERNING MARIJUANA WITH RESPECT TO PRIVILEGES FOR RESEARCH LICENSES, LOCAL AUTHORITY NOTIFICATIONS, THE RETAIL LICENSING MERIT-BASED APPLICATION PROCESS, CERTAIN TRANSFERS OF PLANTS AND SEEDS, LICENSING AGREEMENTS AND CONTRACTS, ADVERTISING, AND JURISDICTIONAL REQUIREMENTS.

(EHB 1857 Representative Kloba)

C 317 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes the transportation of immature marijuana plants, clones, and seeds to certain licensees and their sale by licensed producers to medical marijuana cooperatives, licensed researchers, and to certain qualified medical marijuana patients and their designated providers.
- Eliminates the competitive, merit-based application process for retail marijuana licenses.
- Limits a marijuana retailer, and its partners, to holding not more than five retail marijuana licenses.
- Requires a retail marijuana licensee to forfeit its license if it fails to open a retail store within a specified time period, subject to specific conditions and limitations.
- Requires that the Liquor and Cannabis Board (LCB) provide tribes and port authorities with legal notices regarding pending marijuana business applications.
- Prohibits the LCB from issuing a marijuana business license for premises located within a reservation or Indian country without the consent of the federally recognized Indian tribe.
- Extends the LCB's members and staff immunity from personal liability for duties performed relating to marijuana activities.
- Authorizes licensees to enter into business contracts or agreements relating to trademarks, trade names, trade secrets, technology, or proprietary information and exempts certain information from disclosure under the Public Records Act.
- Requires the Washington State Department of Agriculture (WSDA) and LCB to study the feasibility of allowing industrial hemp to be sold to marijuana processors.
- Revises and clarifies regulations pertaining to the advertising of marijuana businesses and products, including a prohibition of advertisements targeting youth or out-of-state residents, the use of commercial mascots, and sign spinners.
- Allows marijuana-related billboards for the sole purpose of identifying the name of a marijuana retailer's business, the nature of the business, and location of the retailer's store.
- Grants rule-making authority to the LCB to adopt advertising regulations, including the text and images that are permissible on marijuana-related outdoor advertising.
- Authorizes local governments to adopt more restrictive laws on marijuana advertising.
- Authorizes an adult to share limited quantities of marijuana products with other adults under specified conditions.
- Creates a voluntary program for the certification and regulation of organic marijuana products that is administered by the WSDA.
- Requires the LCB to conduct a study of regulatory options for the legalization of marijuana plant possession and cultivation by recreational marijuana users.

SSB 5537 AUTHORIZING LICENSED SPIRITS AND WINE DISTRIBUTORS TO SELL SPIRITS AND WINE PRODUCTS TO THEIR EMPLOYEES IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES

Prime Sponsor: Senator King

(HB 1599 Representative Farrell)

C 160 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes licensed spirits distributors to sell spirits, and licensed wine distributors to sell wine, that cannot reasonably be sold in the normal course of business, directly to their full-time employees, subject to restrictions.
- Requires that all sales to employees are subject to the same taxes that a consumer would pay at a retail sale.

SSB 5589 CONCERNING DISTILLERY PROMOTIONAL ITEMS AND SPIRIT SAMPLE SALES

Prime Sponsor: Senator Keiser

C 260 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows any licensed distiller to charge for spirits samples with nonalcoholic mixers, mixers with alcohol of the distiller's own production, water, and/or ice; each person is limited to two ounces of spirits per person, per day.

ESB 5665 CONCERNING THE USE OF CREDIT CARDS FOR PURCHASES OF BEER, SPIRITS, AND WINE BY THE PURCHASER LICENSED TO SELL BEER, SPIRITS, AND/OR WINE FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE LICENSED PREMISES

Prime Sponsor: Senator Wilson

(HB 1893 Representative Vick)

C 190 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes a licensed distributor of beer, spirits, and/or wine to impose a credit card fee on a purchaser licensed to sell beer, spirits, and/or wine for on-premises consumption.

ESB 5834 CONCERNING THE LICENSING OF BONDED SPIRITS WAREHOUSES

Prime Sponsor: Senator Baumgartner

C 229 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates a new license for bonded spirits warehouses for the storage and handling of spirits, off the premises of a distillery.
- Requires physical separation in the licensed spirits warehouse of bonded and nonbonded spirits.
- Authorizes an annual permit that allows for unlimited transfers to and from the warehouses.
- Authorizes certain industry members to maintain a warehouse for the storage or distribution of bottled spirits of their own production and certain bottled foreign-made spirits.

SSB 5835 PROMOTING HEALTHY OUTCOMES FOR PREGNANT WOMEN AND INFANTS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Keiser

C 294 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires an employer to provide reasonable accommodation in employment for pregnancy unless the accommodation would impose an undue hardship on the employer's business.
- Requires certain health care facilities to establish skin-to-skin contact and room-in policies for newborn infants.
- Creates the Healthy Pregnancy Advisory Committee to develop a strategy to improve health outcomes for mothers and infants.

SHB 1038 INCREASING THE NUMBER OF TASTING ROOMS ALLOWED UNDER A DOMESTIC WINERY LICENSE

Prime Sponsor: Representative Condotta

(SB 5426 Senator Warnick)

C 238 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Increases, from two to four, the number of separate locations from which a domestic winery may serve samples of its own products, sell its own wine at retail, and sell its own wine in kegs or sanitary containers.

SHB 1176 CONCERNING THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE MEAD

Prime Sponsor: Representative Muri

C 8 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Defines the alcoholic beverage mead.
- Excludes the production of mead from the agricultural commodity assessment which funds the Washington Wine Commission's promotion of Washington wines.
- Authorizes liquor retail licensees with privileges to sell beer or cider to customers in growlers to similarly sell mead in such containers.

HB 1250 AUTHORIZING RETAIL MARIJUANA OUTLETS TO GIVE A FREE LOCKABLE DRUG BOX TO ADULTS AGE TWENTY-ONE YEARS AND OVER AND TO QUALIFYING PATIENTS AGE EIGHTEEN YEARS AND OVER SUBJECT TO RESTRICTIONS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Griffey

C 131 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes licensed marijuana retail outlets to receive from another person or entity and donate, at no cost, a lockable box intended for the secure storage of marijuana products and paraphernalia and literature about the lockable boxes.
- Authorizes the retailers to also purchase and sell lockable boxes, so long as the sales price is not less than the cost of acquisition.

HB 1274 CONCERNING THE MEMBER REQUIREMENT FOR BONA FIDE CHARITABLE OR NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Sawyer

(SB 5190 Senator Conway)

C 133 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Modifies the requirements necessary to qualify as a bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization for gambling purposes by removing the requirement that the organizations have at least 15 bona fide active members with equal voting rights.

HB 1329 MODIFYING MONETARY PENALTIES IMPOSED FOR INFRACTIONS RELATING TO MOBILE AND MANUFACTURED HOME INSTALLATION

Prime Sponsor: Representative McCabe

(SB 5341 Senator King)

C 10 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Replaces the mandatory penalty of \$1,000 for each infraction related to the mobile and manufactured home installation requirements with a discretionary penalty of \$250 for the first infraction and not more than \$1,000 for subsequent infractions.
- Requires the Department of Labor and Industries to make rules setting a schedule of penalties.

E2SHB 1351 AUTHORIZING, UNDER ONE LICENSE, THE SALE OF SPIRITS, BEER, AND WINE AT RETAIL FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION

C 96 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Establishes a combination spirits, beer, and wine retail license that authorizes the sale of spirits, beer, and wine for off-premises consumption.

HB 1352 CONCERNING LICENSING AND REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS OF SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Barkis

(SB 5230 Senator Wilson)

C 243 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires the Attorney General (AG) to review the Administrative Procedure Act and certain other laws to identify the rights and protections for small business owners subject to agency audits, inspections, and other enforcement actions.
- Requires certain agencies to review agency statutes, rules, and other documents to identify the rights and protections for small business owners and provide information to the AG.
- Requires the AG to report and make recommendations to the relevant committees of the Legislature.

SHB 1420 CONCERNING THEATRICAL WRESTLING

Prime Sponsor: Representative Hudgins

C 46 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates a theatrical wrestling school license and permits the schools to schedule a limited number of public performances.
- Exempts trainees at a theatrical wrestling school from licensure.
- Requires wrestling show promoters to have an ambulance unit or emergency medical technician present during the wrestling show.

HB 1475 CLARIFYING THE LIMITED AUTHORITY OF GAMBLING COMMISSION OFFICERS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Irwin

(SB 5582 Senator Honeyford)

C 111 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes a Washington State Gambling Commission limited authority peace officer to take reasonably necessary action to prevent physical injury to a person and substantial damage to property when it occurs within the officer's presence.
- Provides immunity from civil liability for damages unless it is shown that the officer acted with gross negligence or bad faith.

ESHB 1538 REQUIRING PRIME CONTRACTORS TO BOND THE SUBCONTRACTORS PORTION OF RETAINAGE UPON REQUEST

Prime Sponsor: Representative Stambaugh

(SB 5222 Senator Hasegawa)

C 302 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires a contractor on a public improvement project, at the request of a subcontractor, to submit a bond to the public owner of the project for the portion of the contractor's retainage that pertains to the subcontractor.

HB 1623 CONCERNING SECONDHAND DEALERS UTILIZING AUTOMATED KIOSKS TO PURCHASE SECONDHAND ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Senn

C 169 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates minimum requirements for automated kiosks in use for the purchase of secondhand electronic property.
- Allows secondhand property purchased through an automated kiosk to be held in the kiosk or off-site during the required 30-day holding period.
- Allows a secondhand dealer utilizing an automated kiosk to maintain the required records at the dealer's principal place of business.

HB 1629 EXTENDING THE REDETERMINATION TIMELINE REGARDING APPEALS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Sells

(SB 5460 Senator Keiser)

C 13 L 17 Effective date 1/1/2018.

- Increases the extension time period from up to 15 working days to up to 45 working days, if agreed to by all parties, for the Director of the Department of Labor and Industries to make a redetermination of a citation, penalty, or the time period to abate a safety violation under the Washington Industrial Safety and Health Act.

HB 1716 CREATING THE CONSTRUCTION REGISTRATION INSPECTION ACCOUNT AS A DEDICATED ACCOUNT TO FUND CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION AND COMPLIANCE, MANUFACTURED AND MOBILE HOMES, RECREATIONAL AND COMMERCIAL VEHICLES, FACTORY BUILT HOUSING AND COMMERCIAL STRUCTURES, ELEVATORS, LIFTING DEVICES, AND MOVING WALKS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Hudgins

C 11 L 17 E3 Effective date 7/1/2017.

- Establishes a dedicated account for the Department of Labor and Industries' elevator, factory-assembled structures, and contractor registration programs.

HB 1718 CREATING A SPECIAL PERMIT FOR CERTAIN WINE AUCTIONS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Jenkin

(SB 5560 Senator Brown)

C 250 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes the Liquor and Cannabis Board to issue a special permit to a nonprofit organization allowing such organization to sell wine through a private auction.
- Authorizes the permit holder to conduct wine tastings at the auction, provided the wine offered for tasting is the same as that being auctioned.
- Authorizes the permit holder to sell wine sourced from multiple wineries, but each winery must be identified on the permit application.

SHB 1755 REQUIRING NOTICE TO STATE FUND EMPLOYERS FOR CERTAIN WORKERS' COMPENSATION THIRD-PARTY SETTLEMENTS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Manweller

(SB 5670 Senator Braun)

C 145 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires notice to a state fund employer of the status of compromise or settlement negotiations of a third-party claim.
- Provides that notice is not required if the costs of the claim are no longer included in the employer's premium calculation or under certain conditions.

SHB 1902 **MODIFYING TAVERN LICENSE PROVISIONS**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Kirby

C 252 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes the Liquor and Cannabis Board to issue a caterer's endorsement to a tavern licensee allowing the licensee to sell and serve liquor taken from its own stocks at specified events at locations other than from the licensed premises of the tavern, subject to specified conditions.
- Authorizes a licensee with the endorsement to store liquor on the unlicensed premises of another party with whom it has an agreement to provide ongoing catering services or at one or more off-site locations provided such locations are owned or controlled by the licensee under a lease.
- Authorizes a licensee with the endorsement to cater events at a domestic winery.
- Authorizes a licensee, or its manager, to furnish beer or wine to the licensee's employees free of charge for use in connection with instruction on beer and wine.

HB 1906 **ALLOWING THE EXPANSION OF COUNTIES QUALIFYING FOR THE FARM INTERNSHIP PROGRAM**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Orcutt

C 150 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Extends the farm internship pilot project from December 31, 2017, to December 31, 2019.
- Adds Clark, Cowlitz, Lewis, and Walla Walla counties to the pilot project.

EHB 1924 **CONCERNING SMALL FOREST LANDOWNERS**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Dent

C 253 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Exempts persons performing certain farm labor contracting activity for a small forest landowner from farm labor contractor licensing requirements and regulations.
- Requires the Department of Natural Resources to develop an analysis on streamlining the issuance of burning permits for small forest landowners.

EHB 2005 **IMPROVING THE BUSINESS CLIMATE IN THIS STATE BY SIMPLIFYING THE ADMINISTRATION OF MUNICIPAL GENERAL BUSINESS LICENSES**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Lytton

C 209 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires most cities to partner with the Department of Revenue (DOR) to administer general business licenses through DOR's Business Licensing Service.
- Requires cities to develop a general business licensing model ordinance.
- Establishes the Local Business and Occupation Tax Apportionment Task Force to recommend changes to simplify the two-factor apportionment formula.

HB 2038 **CLARIFYING THE APPLICABILITY OF RCW 70.345.080 TO ONLY VAPOR PRODUCTS**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Jenkin

C 210 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Removes a provision prohibiting retailers from offering tobacco products for sale in open, unsecured displays from a vapor products regulatory statute.

ESB 5023 CHANGING PROVISIONS RELATING TO SCHOOL DISTRICT EXCESS LEVIES

Prime Sponsor: Senator Wellman

(HB 1059 Representative Lytton)

C 6 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017*.

- Delays until 2018 changes to the formulas for calculating school district maximum maintenance and operation levy authority, and corresponding local effort assistance.
- Requires local levy revenue to be deposited into a separate school district sub-fund beginning in calendar year 2018.
- Provides that the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction must approve the use of maintenance and operation levy proceeds prior to a levy proposition election.
- Took effect on July 23, 2017, but the provisions were substantially amended in EHB 2242, which passed the Legislature on June 30, 2017 and will take effect on October 19, 2017 (please see EHB 2242).

- Allows local governments, school districts, institutions of higher education, and nonprofit organizations to contribute funds to the Early Start Account to expand access and eligibility in the Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP).
- Provides that children enrolled in ECEAP with funds contributed from community sources are not eligible for, or part of, the state-funded entitlement.
- Directs the Department of Early Learning to reduce barriers and increase efficiency for using local or private funds, or both, to the greatest extent possible, to provide more high quality early learning programs.

SB 5129 CONCERNING CHARTER SCHOOL STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN INTERSCHOOL ATHLETICS AND EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

(HB 1208 Representative Johnson)

C 60 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Removes from statute the provision that states that, unless provided otherwise, students at charter schools may only participate in interschool athletic or other interschool extracurricular activities offered by the student's resident school district.
- Makes charter schools responsible for the full cost, minus any student participation fee, for any student who participates in an interschool athletic or other interschool extracurricular activity.

SSB 5142 CONCERNING EDUCATIONAL INTERPRETERS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Kuderer

(HB 1303 Representative Stambaugh)

C 34 L 17 Effective date 4/17/2017.

- Allows educational interpreters who have not successfully achieved the performance standards required by the Professional Educator Standards Board to provide or continue providing interpreter services for a limited time.
- Requires the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction to submit a report to the Legislature on the costs, timelines, and feasibility of conducting a peer review of the Educational Signed Skills Evaluation.

SSB 5241 CONCERNING THE EDUCATIONAL SUCCESS OF YOUTH WHO ARE HOMELESS OR IN FOSTER CARE

Prime Sponsor: Senator Carlyle

(HB 1628 Representative Kagi)

C 40 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires school districts to grant and consolidate partial credit and coursework to eliminate academic and nonacademic barriers for homeless students and students in foster care.
- Directs the Superintendent of Public Instruction to adopt rules to implement these requirements.

2SSB 5258 CREATING THE WASHINGTON ACADEMIC, INNOVATION, AND MENTORING (AIM) PROGRAM

Prime Sponsor: Senator Zeiger

C 180 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates in statute the Washington Academic, Innovation, and Mentoring (AIM) program which was previously only in the omnibus appropriations act. Requires entities that provide the programs and nonprofit entities applying for funding to provide after-school and during the summer programs designed for youth mentoring and academic enrichment.
- Directs the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction to submit annual reports outlining the programs established, target populations, and pre- and post-test results.

SSB 5357 ESTABLISHING A PILOT PROJECT TO LICENSE OUTDOOR EARLY LEARNING AND CHILD CARE PROGRAMS

(HB 1875 Representative Kagi)

C 162 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Establishes a four-year pilot project to license outdoor, nature-based early learning and child care programs, subject to appropriations.
- Allows the Department of Early Learning (DEL) to waive or adapt licensing requirements when necessary to allow for the operation of outdoor classrooms.
- Requires DEL to submit annual status reports during the pilot project and a full report in 2020.

SSB 5404 PERMITTING THE POSSESSION AND APPLICATION OF TOPICAL SUNSCREEN PRODUCTS AT SCHOOLS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Rivers

(HB 1573 Representative Harris)

C 186 L 17 Effective date 5/4/2017.

- Allows students, parents, and school personnel to possess sunscreen products while on school property, at a school-related event or activity, or summer camp.
- Specifies that a prescription or note of a licensed health care professional is not necessary if the sunscreen is regulated for over-the-counter use.
- Provides that state law regarding the administration of medication at school does not apply to topical sunscreen products.

ESSB 5449 CONCERNING DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP, MEDIA LITERACY, AND INTERNET SAFETY IN SCHOOLS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Liias

C 90 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires the Washington State School Directors' Association to review and revise its model policy and procedures on electronic resources and Internet safety and to develop a checklist for school districts.
- Directs the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to create a website with links to recommended successful practices and resources to support digital citizenship, media literacy, and Internet safety.
- Tasks OSPI with surveying teacher-librarians, principals, and technology directors to understand how they are currently integrating digital citizenship and media literacy education in their curriculum.

SB 5488 CHANGING THE ANNUAL REPORTING DATE FOR THE TRANSITIONAL BILINGUAL INSTRUCTION PROGRAM

Prime Sponsor: Senator Zeiger

(HB 1690 Representative Santos)

C 123 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Changes the date by which the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction must annually review and report to the Legislature on the Transitional Bilingual Instruction Program from January 1st to February 1st.

SSB 5605 ALIGNING THE OFFICE OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION'S BACKGROUND CHECK AUTHORITY WITH THAT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EARLY LEARNING

Prime Sponsor: Senator Walsh

C 33 L 17 E3 Effective date 10/19/2017.

- Allows individuals who have completed background checks with the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to submit these results to the Department of Early Learning to meet its background check requirements.
- Requires a record check for employees who will have regularly scheduled unsupervised access to developmentally disabled persons and allows school districts and other educational entities to request background checks for prospective volunteers.
- Provides OSPI authority to charge fees for background checks and establishes a criminal background check account.
- Allows OSPI to consider founded reports of child abuse or neglect when determining whether an individual lacks good moral character or personal fitness.

SB 5662 AUTHORIZING THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION TO DESIGNATE A MEMBER OF THE PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR STANDARDS BOARD

C 189 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows the Superintendent of Public Instruction to appoint a designee to fill the Superintendent of Public Instruction's membership on the Professional Educator Standards Board.

ESHB 1017 ADDRESSING THE SITING OF SCHOOLS AND SCHOOL FACILITIES

Prime Sponsor: Representative McCaslin

C 129 L 17 Partial Veto Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows a county that has a population between 840,000 and 1.5 million and abuts at least six other counties to authorize the siting in a rural area of a school that serves students from an urban area when certain requirements are met.
- Requires the multicounty planning policy that the county is part of to be amended to include a policy that addresses the siting of schools in rural areas of all counties subject to the multicounty planning policy.

Partial Veto: Vetoed section:

- Authorizing a county planning under the Growth Management Act to extend public facilities and utilities to serve a school sited in a rural area that serves rural and urban students when certain requirements are met.

HB 1042 ELIMINATING THE OFFICE OF THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER'S SCHOOL DISTRICT OR EDUCATIONAL SERVICE DISTRICT ANNUAL REPORT

C 7 L 17 E3 Effective date 10/19/2017.

- Removes the requirement that school districts and their benefit providers annually submit data and reports to the Office of the Insurance Commissioner (OIC) regarding their health insurance benefits.
- Repeals the statute requiring OIC to annually submit a report to the Governor, the Health Care Authority, and the Legislature on school district health insurance benefits.

ESHB 1115 CONCERNING PARAEDUCATORS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Bergquist

(SB 5070 Senator Rivers)

C 237 L 17 Partial Veto Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Establishes statewide minimum employment requirements and standards of practice for paraeducators.
- Creates the Paraeducator Board to develop rules and policies for paraeducator related coursework and general, advanced, and specialty paraeducator certificates.
- Requires that, beginning September 1, 2019, and subject to funding, school districts must: (1) provide paraeducators with general courses on the standards of practice, and (2) ensure all paraeducators meet the general certification requirements within three years of completing the fundamental course of study.
- Provides grants to school districts to pilot standards of practice and paraeducator certificates, expands qualifying endorsements for paraeducator scholarship programs, and requires the Washington State Institute for Public Policy to conduct a study on the effectiveness of paraeducators.

- Expanding eligible endorsement areas for alternative route programs for paraeducators.

SHB 1235 ASSESSING PHYSICAL EDUCATION PRACTICES IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

C 80 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires school districts to conduct an annual review of their physical education (PE) programs.
- Tasks the K-12 Data Governance Group with developing protocols and guidance for the collection of PE data by school districts.
- Directs school districts to submit the results of the PE program review to the district's wellness committee and the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

SHB 1279 CONCERNING SCHOOL SAFETY DRILLS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Pettigrew

C 165 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Revises the requirements for safety-related drills in schools, which must occur at least once per month, when school is in session with students present.
- States that the drills must teach students the basic functional drill responses of shelter-in-place, lockdown, and evacuation.
- Requires the drills to incorporate a pedestrian evacuation drill for schools mapped in tsunami hazard zones and allows the drills to incorporate an earthquake drill.

E2SHB 1341 CONCERNING PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION FOR TEACHERS AND SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS

C 26 L 17 E3 Partial Veto Effective date 7/7/2017.

- Allows teachers and principals to renew their residency certificate in five-year intervals by completing ten credits or 100 clock-hours.

Partial Veto: Vetoed section:

- Establishing the Professional Educator Collaborative to make recommendations to improve and strengthen state policies, programs, and pathways that lead to highly effective educators at each level of the public school system.

SHB 1346 CLARIFYING THE AUTHORITY OF A NURSE WORKING IN A SCHOOL SETTING

Prime Sponsor: Representative Springer

(SB 5325 Senator Zeiger)

C 84 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Specifies that a registered nurse or an advanced registered nurse practitioner working in a school setting is authorized and responsible for the nursing care of students to the extent that the care is within the practice of nursing.
- Provides that a school administrator may supervise a registered nurse or an advanced registered nurse practitioner in aspects of employment other than the practice of nursing.
- States that only a registered nurse or an advanced registered nurse practitioner may supervise, direct, or evaluate a licensed nurse working in a school setting with respect to the practice of nursing.

SHB 1444 FACILITATING ON-TIME GRADE LEVEL PROGRESSION AND GRADUATION FOR CERTAIN STUDENTS

C 166 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires school districts to incorporate procedures to facilitate the on-time grade level progression and graduation of at-risk youth, children in need of services, and homeless students.
- States that school districts must waive local graduation requirements if a student has enrolled in three or more school districts as a high school student and has met state requirements but is ineligible to graduate after all alternatives have been considered.

SHB 1445 CONCERNING DUAL LANGUAGE IN EARLY LEARNING AND K-12 EDUCATION

(SB 5529 Senator Rolfes)

C 236 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates the K-12 Dual Language Grant program administered by the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) and the Bilingual Educator Initiative administered by the Professional Educator Standards Board (PESB).
- Requires the Department of Early Learning to work with community partners to support outreach and education for parents and families around the benefits of native language development and retention.
- Directs OSPI and PESB to submit a combined report to the Legislature on successes, best practices, lessons learned, and outcomes of the grant programs.

C 171 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Changes the membership of the Early Learning Advisory Council.
- Requires the Department of Early Learning, rather than a private-public partnership, to administer home visiting programs.

HB 1732 CONCERNING THE CONFIDENTIALITY OF EDUCATOR PROFESSIONAL GROWTH PLANS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Springer

(SB 5547 Senator Rolfes)

C 16 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Provides that the Professional Growth Plans in educator license renewals submitted through the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction's electronic certification system are exempt from public inspection and copying.

HB 1734 AUTHORIZING REIMBURSEMENT FOR SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS PARTICIPATING IN ACTIVITIES OF THE WASHINGTON STATE PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR STANDARDS BOARD TO CARRY OUT ITS POWERS AND DUTIES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Lovick

(SB 5548 Senator Rivers)

C 17 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires payments to school districts for substitutes needed because the Professional Educator Standard Board has requested certificated or classified school district employees to serve on a committee that furthers education in the state.

SHB 1741 CONCERNING EDUCATOR PREPARATION DATA FOR USE BY THE PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR STANDARDS BOARD

Prime Sponsor: Representative Slatter

(SB 5526 Senator Zeiger)

C 172 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires state-approved educator preparation programs to collect, provide data to, and enter into data-sharing agreements with the Education Research and Data Center (ERDC).
- Directs ERDC to hold, analyze, and make data on educator preparation available for research and monitoring by the Professional Educator Standards Board, state-approved educator preparation programs, and other researchers with appropriate data-sharing agreements.

ESHB 2224 PROVIDING FLEXIBILITY IN HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS AND SUPPORTING STUDENT SUCCESS DURING THE TRANSITION TO A FEDERAL EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT-COMPLIANT ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM

- Clarifies board appointment procedures for tribal members.
- Clarifies board members' initial term lengths.

ESB 5128 **ALLOWING INCREMENTAL ELECTRICITY PRODUCED AS A RESULT OF CERTAIN CAPITAL INVESTMENT PROJECTS TO QUALIFY AS AN ELIGIBLE RENEWABLE RESOURCE UNDER THE ENERGY INDEPENDENCE ACT**

(HB 1519 Representative Blake)

C 315 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows a qualifying utility to use incremental electricity produced as a result of a capital investment, as an eligible renewable resource to comply with Initiative 937, the Energy Independence Act.
- Requires the facility to demonstrate through direct or calculated measurement the increase in electricity as a result of the capital investment.
- Requires the capital investment to be completed after March 31, 1999, and made to a facility that commenced operation before March 31, 1999, and generates qualified biomass energy.

SB 5162 **CREATING THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT OPERATOR CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT**

(HB 1267 Representative DeBolt)

C 35 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates the Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Certification account.
- Repeals provision requiring fees received for the administration of the Wastewater Operator Certification program to be deposited into the state General Fund.

SB 5261 **CONCERNING IRRIGATION DISTRICT AUTHORITY**

Prime Sponsor: Senator Warnick

(HB 1578 Representative Dent)

C 63 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows irrigation districts to enter into contracts or agreements with private commercial or industrial entities that construct or operate electric power generation or transmission facilities or acquire electric power for their own use or resale.
- Provides limitations on an irrigation district's liability when entering into contracts or agreements with investor-owned utilities or private commercial or industrial entities.

ESSB 5470 **ADVANCING THE DEVELOPMENT OF RENEWABLE ENERGY BY IMPROVING THE PERMITTING PROCESS FOR GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES EXPLORATION**

C 259 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows a single permit and permit fee for drilling all core holes for a project gathering geothermal data.
- Removes the geothermal permit fee, hearing, and notice requirements for core holes that are drilled more than 750 feet into the bedrock or for the discovery of geothermal energy.

ESSB 5939 PROMOTING A SUSTAINABLE, LOCAL RENEWABLE ENERGY INDUSTRY THROUGH MODIFYING RENEWABLE ENERGY SYSTEM TAX INCENTIVES AND PROVIDING GUIDANCE FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY SYSTEM COMPONENT RECYCLING

C 36 L 17 E3 Effective date 7/7/2017.

- Closes the Renewable Energy Cost-Recovery Incentive Program to new customer participants after September 30, 2017.

Certification is for a term of eight years or when 50 percent of the of the total system price is reached, whichever comes first.

- Increases the PUT credit cap to 1.5 percent of businesses' taxable power sales in calendar year 2014.
- Requires Washington State University to cease certifications for the new production incentive program when it is likely to exceed \$110 million.

- Requires a community solar company to register with the Utilities and Transportation Commission before engaging in business in Washington.

- Expires certain sales and use tax exemptions for machinery and equipment using solar energy to generate electricity or produce thermal heat on September 30, 2017.

HB 1001 CONCERNING UTILITY EASEMENTS ON STATE-OWNED AQUATIC LANDS

- Extends the statutory schedule that sets charges for public utility lines crossing over state-owned aquatic lands from July 1, 2017, to July 1, 2030.

C 278 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Permits three or more eastern Washington counties to form a consortium to jointly operate a juvenile detention facility if the total combined population of the participating counties is greater than 200,000.
- Allows a county that withdraws from a consortium to rejoin the consortium at a later time if a majority of the consortium members approve.
- Clarifies that the legislation only applies to an existing consortium and not any other juvenile facilities.

SHB 1988 IMPLEMENTING A VULNERABLE YOUTH GUARDIANSHIP PROGRAM

Prime Sponsor: Representative Ortiz-Self

(SB 5559 Senator Darneille)

C 279 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates a new legal proceeding, known as a Vulnerable Youth Guardianship, for an immigrant youth 18 to 21 years of age who is abandoned, abused, or neglected.
- Requires the Washington State Task Force Against the Trafficking of Persons to evaluate whether appointing a non-relative guardian may increase the risk of the youth being trafficked and recommend ways to reduce this risk, subject to a specific appropriation for this purpose.

SB 5011 CONCERNING THE BUSINESS CORPORATION ACT

Prime Sponsor: Senator Pedersen

C 28 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Establishes a statutory procedure for ratifying and validating defective corporate actions.
- Authorizes forum selection provisions for internal corporate disputes.
- Permits asset drop-down transactions without approval by parent corporation's shareholders.
- Eliminates ten-year term limits on voting trusts and voting agreements.
- Permits short-form downstream mergers.

SSB 5012 CONCERNING THE DISTRIBUTION OF A WASHINGTON TRUST'S ASSETS TO ANOTHER TRUST

Prime Sponsor: Senator Pedersen

C 29 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Makes changes to procedures for modifying a trust or for distributing assets from a first trust to a second trust.
- Defines a charitable trust and requires a trustee to give written notice to the state Attorney General prior to exercising decanting powers where a trust includes a charitable provision.

SB 5030 CONCERNING HUMAN TRAFFICKING, PROSTITUTION, AND COMMERCIAL SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

Prime Sponsor: Senator Darneille

(EHB 1078 Representative Pellicciotti)

C 231 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Extends the statute of limitations for trafficking crimes to ten years after the crime is committed.
- Extends the statute of limitations for commercial sexual abuse of a minor and promoting commercial sexual abuse of a minor to the later of the victim's thirtieth birthday or ten years after the crime occurs.
- Defines the profits or compensation relating to commercial sexual abuse, promoting commercial sexual abuse, and promoting prostitution of a minor to be anything of value.

SB 5037 MAKING A FOURTH DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OFFENSE A FELONY

Prime Sponsor: Senator Padden

C 335 L 17 Partial Veto Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Makes Driving Under the Influence (DUI) or being in physical control of a motor vehicle while under the influence (PC) a felony offense if the person's criminal record includes three or more prior offenses within the applicable time periods.
- Makes a fourth DUI or PC offense a felony ranked at Level IV—instead of Level V—on the felony sentence grid.

Partial Veto: Vetoed section:

- Adding a \$50 fee to be assessed on all persons convicted, sentenced to a lesser charge, or given a deferred prosecution as a result of a conviction for DUI, PC, Vehicular Homicide, or Vehicular Assault to fund grants for organizations within counties to combat DUI of alcohol or drugs.

SB 5039 ADOPTING THE UNIFORM ELECTRONIC LEGAL MATERIAL ACT

Prime Sponsor: Senator Pedersen

C 106 L 17 Effective date 1/1/2018.

- Defines the Washington State Constitution, session laws, Revised Code of Washington, and agency rules as legal materials.
- Requires the state to designate the electronic record as the official record and authenticate it, if the state publishes legal materials solely in electronic form; authenticated records are presumed to be accurate.
- Grants that legal materials must be complete, intact, usable, and publically available on a permanent basis.
- Requires the state to provide for the back-up and disaster recovery of legal materials designated as the official record and published electronically.

SB 5040 MAKING REVISIONS TO THE UNIFORM BUSINESS ORGANIZATIONS CODE

Prime Sponsor: Senator Pedersen

C 31 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Aligns and clarifies the contents of a certificate of registration for a foreign entity doing business in Washington State with the contents of a certificate of existence for a domestic entity.
- Makes other clarifying changes to the Uniform Business Organizations Code to ensure provisions refer to the appropriate business entity.

SSB 5069 PROVIDING ASSOCIATE DEGREE EDUCATION TO ENHANCE EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES AND PUBLIC SAFETY

Prime Sponsor: Senator Walsh

(HB 1129 Representative Haler)

C 120 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes the Department of Corrections to implement associate degree education programs at state correctional institutions to provide inmates with an associate workforce degree designed to prepare the inmate to enter the workforce.

SSB 5077 ALLOWING THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS TO PROVIDE TEMPORARY HOUSING ASSISTANCE TO INDIVIDUALS BEING RELEASED FROM CERTAIN CORRECTIONS CENTERS FOR WOMEN

Prime Sponsor: Senator Angel

C 214 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows the Department of Corrections (DOC) to provide rental vouchers for up to three months to any person releasing from the Washington Corrections Center for Women (WCCW) or the Mission Creek Corrections Center for Women (MCCCW), if the assistance will support the person's release into the community.
- Requires DOC to submit a report no later than November 1, 2020, to the Legislature on the effectiveness of providing rental vouchers to persons releasing from WCCW and MCCCW.

SSB 5081 ADOPTING THE REVISED UNIFORM LAW ON NOTARIAL ACTS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Pedersen

C 281 L 17 Effective date 7/1/2018.

- Adopts uniform processes for notarial acts.
- Repeals and replaces dated notary public laws.
- Defines and creates a license endorsement for an "electronic records notary public."
- Prohibits notaries from providing legal advice or representing a person in an immigration proceeding, excepting licensed attorneys and limited license legal technicians acting within the scope of their license.
- Requires a notary to keep a journal of all notarial acts performed.
- Does not require notary applicants and renewing notaries to pass a course or exam.

SSB 5083 REQUIRING THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY TO USE REASONABLE EFFORTS IN NOTIFYING A VICTIM OF A SEX OR KIDNAPPING OFFENDER'S PETITION FOR RELIEF FROM REGISTRATION

Prime Sponsor: Senator Pearson

C 86 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires the prosecuting attorney make reasonable efforts to notify the victim when a sex or kidnapping offender petitions for relief from registration.

SB 5085 ENACTING THE UNIFORM VOIDABLE TRANSACTIONS ACT

Prime Sponsor: Senator Pedersen

C 57 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Changes the title of the state Uniform Fraudulent Transfer Act to the Uniform Voidable Transactions Act (UVTA).
- Provides that a creditor making a claim for relief under the UVTA has the burden of proof by a preponderance of the evidence.
- Defines a debtor is insolvent if, at a fair valuation, the sum of the debtor's debts is greater than the sum of the debtor's assets.
- Grants that the UVTA is not applied retroactively to transfers made or obligations incurred prior to the effect date.

ESSB 5256 CONCERNING SEXUAL ASSAULT PROTECTION ORDERS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Fain

(HB 1384 Representative Goodman)

C 233 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Permits a sexual assault protection order to be made permanent rather than limit the protection order to a two year duration.
- Modifies the procedure for renewal of a sexual assault protection order to require renewal upon motion unless the respondent shows that there will be no contact with the petitioner after the order expires.
- Establishes procedures for a respondent to petition to terminate or modify the terms of a sexual assault protection order, including terms related to firearms, dangerous weapons, or concealed pistol licenses.
- Permits a court to modify firearms restrictions in a sexual assault protection order as provided in RCW 7.90.170.

ESB 5266 CONCERNING THEFT OF RENTAL OR LEASED PROPERTY

Prime Sponsor: Senator O'Ban

(HB 1292 Representative Stokesbary)

Governor vetoed.

Full Veto:

- Charging persons who intentionally hold personal property beyond the expiration period as guilty of theft of rental or leased property.
- Establishing that these persons may not claim a defense of returned property when they fail to pay applicable rental charges.
- Determining an applicable rental charge by specified late return provisions in the written rental agreement, or by the rental rate in the agreement prorated from the due date to the receipt of the returned property.
- Requiring written warnings that failure to return property and pay all outstanding obligations may result in charges up to a gross misdemeanor.
- Applying only to rental or leased property, and does not apply to lease purchased property, rent to own property, motor vehicles, and medical equipment.
- Imposing penalties up to a gross misdemeanor based on the outstanding obligation owed.

SB 5268 CONCERNING NOTICE TO THE LICENSEE BEFORE A CONCEALED PISTOL LICENSE EXPIRES

Prime Sponsor: Senator Takko

C 282 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Provides for 60 days notice of expiration to a concealed pistol license holder who provides an email address at the time of the application for the current license.
- Providing an email address is optional at the applicant's discretion.
- Designates the Department of Licensing as the entity required to give notice.

SSB 5272 VACATING CONVICTIONS ARISING FROM OFFENSES COMMITTED AS A RESULT OF BEING A VICTIM OF TRAFFICKING, PROMOTING PROSTITUTION, OR PROMOTING COMMERCIAL SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

Prime Sponsor: Senator Saldaña

(HB 1112 Representative Orwall)

C 128 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows a victim of Trafficking, Promoting Prostitution in the first degree or Commercial Sex Abuse of a Minor to vacate the record of a related prostitution conviction, even if the person has been convicted of another crime since the date of the conviction, if the person can prove by a preponderance of evidence that the other conviction was also a result of Trafficking, Promoting Prostitution in the first degree or Commercial Sex Abuse of a Minor.
- Requires a motion for vacation of a prostitution conviction to be supported by the sworn testimony of the applicant at a hearing before the court.

SSB 5277 CONCERNING DISQUALIFICATION OF JUDGES

Prime Sponsor: Senator Padden

(EHB 1378 Representative Graves)

C 42 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Replaces the motion and affidavit of prejudice against a judge with a notice of disqualification.
- Expands the list of rulings by a judge that do not affect the right to file a notice of disqualification.

SSB 5327 CLARIFYING THE DUTIES OF COURT CLERKS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Angel

(HB 1396 Representative Graves)

C 183 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Maintains the current statutory requirement for the court clerk to conform its performance to the court's direction.
- Relieves court clerks from the duty to forward residential time summary reports to the Department of Social Health and Services, Division of Child Support each month.
- Discontinues the annual legislative report from the Washington Association of County Officials regarding the legal financial obligations the county clerks collect.

SB 5336 CRIMINALIZING DAMAGING, DESTROYING, TAMPERING, OR REMOVING BALLOT RETURN BOXES OR CONTENTS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Miloscia

(HB 1472 Representative Hudgins)

C 283 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Makes the act of physically damaging, destroying, or tampering with a ballot deposit box or its contents a crime of malicious mischief.
- Increases the criminal penalty for removing a ballot from a ballot drop location to a Class C felony.

SSB 5356 CONCERNING THE HUMANE TREATMENT OF DOGS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Fain

C 65 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Defines specific elements of unlawful and inhumane restraint of a dog by the neck on a rope or tie-out device.
- Applies a recklessness standard prohibiting a person from leaving a dog tied up for a long enough time to risk substantial harm, when a reasonable person in the same circumstances would not disregard the risk.
- Requires a person to ensure a tethered dog's surroundings are sanitary and safe with access to enough shelter, food, water, and freedom of movement to meet its needs for comfort and health.
- Creates civil infraction penalties for inhumane dog tethering.

SSB 5374 CONCERNING STATE EMPLOYEE WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTION

Prime Sponsor: Senator Becker

C 44 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Amends the Whistleblower Protection Program to include ex parte communication between an agency employee and a presiding officer that violates the Administrative Procedures Act or other similar provisions of law.
- Protects the confidentiality of an employee who reports improper governmental conduct to the State Auditor or other public official regardless of whether an investigation is initiated.

ESSB 5388 CONCERNING THE REMOVAL OF UNAUTHORIZED PERSONS FROM CERTAIN PREMISES

Prime Sponsor: Senator Zeiger

(HB 1305 Representative Barkis)

C 284 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Establishes a process for an owner or an agent to provide to law enforcement a declaration under penalty of perjury stating that persons have entered the premises unlawfully.
- Gives the occupant the opportunity to secure and provide contrary credible evidence which must be considered by the officer.
- Allows law enforcement to remove the persons, with or without arresting them, and to order them to remain off the premises or be subject to arrest for criminal trespass.
- Provides that law enforcement is not to be held liable.
- Allows a person or persons removed from property on the basis of false statements in a declaration to pursue a cause of action against the declarant.

ESSB 5552 CONCERNING FIREARMS SALES AND TRANSFERS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Pedersen

(HB 1731 Representative Jinkins)

C 264 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Excludes flare guns, other visual distress signaling devices, and powder activated construction devices from the definition of firearm.
- Modifies the definition of transfer to exclude the delivery of a firearm owned or leased by an entity licensed or qualified to do business in the state of Washington to, or return of the firearm by, any of that entity's employees or agents for lawful purposes in the ordinary course of business.
- Exempts transfers between parents-in-law and siblings-in-law from the background check requirements when the transfer is a bona fide gift or loan.
- Allows temporary transfers of firearms intended to prevent suicide or self-inflicted bodily harm without a background check.
- Exempts transfers between spouses or domestic partners if the firearm remains in the presence of the transferor from background check requirements under circumstances in which the transferee and firearm remain in the presence of the transferor.
- Exempts sales or transfers when the seller or transferee is a federally licensed collector and the firearm being sold or transferred is a curio or relic or transfers by honor guards.

SB 5632 MODIFYING ORGANIZED RETAIL THEFT PROVISIONS

Prime Sponsor: Senator O'Ban

C 329 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Adds an additional way to commit organized retail theft with at least six accomplices and where the person makes or receives at least one electronic communication seeking participation in the theft.
- Allows the thefts committed by the principal and accomplices to be aggregated into one count.
- Determines the degree of theft by the value of all the property stolen.

SB 5635 CONCERNING RETAIL THEFT WITH SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

Prime Sponsor: Senator Padden

C 224 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Clarifies that retail theft with special circumstances can be committed while possessing any item or device used under circumstances indicating an intent to use or employ for the theft.
- Clarifies the item or device does not have to be designed specifically to overcome security systems.
- Allows aggregation of thefts into a single count.

ESSB 5810 ADDING ATTEMPTED MURDER TO THE LIST OF OFFENSES THAT MAY NOT BE PROSECUTED MORE THAN TEN YEARS THEIR COMMISSION

Prime Sponsor: Senator Padden

C 125 L 17 Effective date 4/25/2017.

- Changes the statute of limitation for attempted murder from three years to ten years.

SB 5813 CONCERNING CRIMES AGAINST MINORS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Padden

C 126 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Prohibits a trafficking defendant from asserting the defense that the age of the victim was unknown or mistaken.
- Raises the felony class for two child sexual abuse imagery offenses from a Class C to a Class B felony.

SHB 1055 CONCERNING PRO BONO LEGAL SERVICES FOR MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, VETERANS, AND THEIR FAMILIES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Kilduff

(SB 5021 Senator O'Ban)

C 163 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Establishes an office for military and veteran legal assistance within the Attorney General's Office, which may not provide criminal legal assistance.
- Creates a legal assistance program that must recruit and train volunteer attorneys and identify service programs for military service members, veterans, and their families.
- Assigns requests for pro bono services to volunteer attorneys and service programs registered with the office.
- Defines family members to include surviving spouse and surviving domestic partner of a deceased service member or veteran.

SHB 1079 CREATING A CRIMINAL NO-CONTACT ORDER FOR HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND PROMOTING PROSTITUTION-RELATED OFFENSES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Orwall

(SB 5029 Senator Padden)

C 230 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates procedures for entry of no-contact orders enforced by general authority law enforcement to prohibit defendants from contacting victims when charged with or convicted of trafficking and promoting prostitution offenses.
- Authorizes the court to impose a no-contact order beginning with arrest or citation and continuing until the case resolves, and directs the order to be provided to law enforcement.
- Authorizes the court to consider the provisions of RCW 9.41.800 when issuing a no-contact order prior to releasing someone before arraignment, and permits a defendant to request modification or termination of the order.
- Makes technical changes for consistent language with other statutes.

HB 1091 AUTHORIZING TRIBAL COURT JUDGES TO SOLEMNIZE MARRIAGES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Appleton

C 130 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes tribal court judges from federally-recognized tribes to solemnize marriages throughout Washington State.

SHB 1100 CONCERNING CONCEALED PISTOL LICENSE RENEWAL NOTICES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Taylor

C 74 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires the Department of Licensing to mail a concealed pistol license (CPL) renewal notification to the license holder approximately 90 days prior to the expiration of the license.
- Creates a CPL Renewal Notification account.
- Provides that \$0.84 of both the CPL original license fee and renewal license fee must be deposited into the CPL Renewal Notification account rather than into the Firearms Range account.

ESHB 1109 SUPPORTING VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT

Prime Sponsor: Representative Orwall

C 290 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates the Washington Sexual Assault Kit Initiative Project to fund the creation of locally based multidisciplinary community response teams to conduct cold case investigations tied to previously unsubmitted sexual assault kits.
- Requires the Criminal Justice Training Commission to incorporate into existing training and develop new training with a victim-centered, trauma-informed approach.

ESHB 1153 CONCERNING CRIMES AGAINST VULNERABLE PERSONS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Goodman

(SB 5099 Senator Bailey)

C 266 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Lowers the requisite mental state for the crimes of Criminal Mistreatment in the first and second degree from recklessness to criminal negligence.
- Creates the crimes of Theft from a Vulnerable Adult in the first degree and second degree, applicable when a person commits theft of property or services from a person the defendant knows or should know is a vulnerable adult.
- Categorizes Criminal Mistreatment—first and second degree—and Theft from a Vulnerable Adult as crimes against persons.
- Encourages counties to develop written protocols for handling criminal cases involving vulnerable adults, and outlines requirements for vulnerable adult advocacy teams.

E2SHB 1163 CONCERNING DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Prime Sponsor: Representative Goodman

C 272 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Elevates Assault in the fourth degree involving domestic violence (DV) from a gross misdemeanor to a Class C felony ranked as a seriousness level IV when a defendant has two or more prior adult convictions for certain crimes involving DV in the previous ten years.
- Counts prior adult convictions for Assault of a Child or Criminal Mistreatment involving DV as two points when calculating an offender score for sentencing pursuant to a felony DV conviction.
- Requires deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA) collection from offenders upon conviction for an Assault in the fourth degree offense when DV was pleaded and proven.
- Provides that sheriffs may waive fees associated with service of writs of habeas corpus issued for return of a child in circumstances in which the person granted the writ is unable to pay due to poverty.
- Requires the Washington State Gender and Justice Commission to convene work groups to address the issues of DV perpetrator treatment and DV risk assessment.
- Prevents the state from using a vacated misdemeanor or gross misdemeanor record of domestic violence in a later criminal prosecution unless the conviction was for violation of a restraining order or stalking, thereby preventing the record from precluding possession of a firearm under federal law.

SHB 1184 MODIFYING PATRONIZING A PROSTITUTE PROVISIONS

(SB 5184 Senator Padden)

Prime Sponsor: Representative Orwall

C 232 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Expands the crime of patronizing a prostitute.
- Makes the crime subject to prosecution in the location where the communication to patronize a prostitute is either sent or received.
- Clarifies that a person may not be prosecuted twice for substantially the same crime.

HB 1195 CONCERNING SURRENDER OF PERSON UNDER SURETY'S BOND

Prime Sponsor: Representative Kilduff

C 78 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires bail bondspersons to surrender defendants to the custody of the jail affiliated with the jurisdiction issuing the warrant resulting in bail.
- Requires the surrendered defendant be held until the next judicial day or until another bond is posted.

SHB 1200 CONCERNING THE CRIME OF VOYEURISM

Prime Sponsor: Representative McCabe

C 292 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates the crime of Voyeurism in the second degree.
- Requires diversion of juvenile offenders for a first violation of Voyeurism in the second degree.

EHB 1248 CORRECTING A CONFLICT BETWEEN STATE AND FEDERAL LAW REGARDING CLASS I CORRECTIONAL INDUSTRIES WORK PROGRAMS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Griffey

C 81 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires the Department of Corrections to make statutorily identified deductions from an inmate's wages, rather than an inmate's gross wages.
- Amends the schedule of deductions from Class I Correctional Industries wages to be a maximum allowable deduction schedule, rather than a minimum deduction schedule.

SHB 1258 CONCERNING PERSONS WITH A DISABILITY PRESENT AT THE SCENE OF AN ACCIDENT

Prime Sponsor: Representative McCabe

C 295 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires the Department of Health, with others, to review existing programs and to design a training program that will familiarize first responders with the techniques, procedures, and protocols for best handling situations in which persons with disabilities are present at the scene of an emergency, subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this purpose.
- Requires the Criminal Justice Training Commission, with others, to examine existing training programs related to law enforcement response to an emergency where a person with a disability may be present, to ensure that those programs are consistent with best practices, subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this purpose.
- Requires the Adjutant General through the Enhanced 911 coordinator with others, to assess, among other things, the resources necessary to immediately display to first responders as part of the Enhanced 911 system that a person with a disability may be present at the scene of an emergency, subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this purpose.

HB 1285 **MODIFYING OATH REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERPRETERS IN LEGAL PROCEEDINGS**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Graves

C 83 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Modifies interpreter oath requirements, allowing interpreters for hearing impaired and non-English-speaking persons to submit an oath once at the time of satisfying initial credentialing requirements with the Office of Deaf and Hard of Hearing or the Administrative Office of the Courts.

ESHB 1493 **CONCERNING BIOMETRIC IDENTIFIERS**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Morris

C 299 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Prohibits a person from enrolling a biometric identifier in a database for a commercial purpose without notice, consent, or a way to prevent subsequent use.
- Prohibits selling, leasing, or disclosing a biometric identifier for a commercial purpose unless consent is obtained or certain criteria are met.
- Establishes requirements regarding biometric identifier retention and access.

SHB 1501 **PROTECTING LAW ENFORCEMENT AND THE PUBLIC FROM PERSONS WHO ILLEGALLY ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN FIREARMS**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Hansen

C 261 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires firearm dealers to report to the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) all instances where the firearm dealer denies an application for the purchase or transfer of a firearm based on ineligibility.
- Requires the WASPC to refer cases for prosecution.
- Requires the WASPC to create and operate a statewide, automated system to notify a registered person when a respondent subject to certain court orders has been denied the purchase of a firearm based on ineligibility.
- Provides that WASPC establishes a grant program for local law enforcement agencies to conduct investigations.
- Requires the Washington State Patrol to maintain a database of reported denials of individuals attempting to purchase a firearm when ineligible.

SHB 1543 **CONCERNING PARENTAL RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF SEXUAL ASSAULT PERPETRATORS AND SURVIVORS**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Doglio

(SB 5321 Senator Rivers)

C 234 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Creates a civil court action to restrict or terminate parental rights when clear and convincing evidence shows that the parent committed a sexual assault resulting in the child's birth.
- Defines "sexual assault" in such civil actions as "nonconsensual sexual penetration that results in pregnancy."
- Prohibits temporary orders for residential time and decision-making unless the parent whose alleged sexual assault resulted in the child's birth is a presumed parent and the court specifically finds the temporary order is in the child's best interests.
- Imposes a time bar of four years after the child's birth for actions determining parentage that allege a sexual assault resulting in the child's birth, subject to two exceptions: (1) the four-year limit does not apply if the child has no presumed or adjudicated second parent and no acknowledged father; and (2) for two years after the act's effective date, a court may waive the four-year time bar if a criminal case or a separate civil case has found that the presumed, adjudicated, or acknowledged parent sexually assaulted the child's other parent resulting in the child's birth.

SHB 1605 CONCERNING VESSEL IMPOUNDMENT

Prime Sponsor: Representative Pettigrew

C 247 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows a law enforcement officer to impound a vessel when the operator is arrested for operating the vessel in a reckless manner or while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Outlines procedures for vessel impoundment, redemption, and forfeiture, and provides liability protection for law enforcement and receiving facilities for actions associated with vessel impoundment.

E2SHB 1614 CONCERNING IMPAIRED DRIVING

Prime Sponsor: Representative Goodman

C 336 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.*

- Imposes an express requirement that in order to vacate a record of conviction for an impaired driving-related prior offense, ten years must have elapsed since the arrest for the prior offense.
- Requires a law enforcement officer to make a warrantless arrest and hold a person suspected of impaired driving in custody when the arresting officer knows that the person is charged with or awaiting arraignment on another offense related to impaired driving.
- Requires 180 consecutive, violation-free days prior to release of an ignition interlock restriction, rather than four months; and creates a medical exemption for the tolling requirement during the time an ignition interlock device is not installed.
- Amends the exceptions to the standard penalties for a second impaired driving offense.
- Makes changes to the laws regarding the admissibility of tests for blood and breath alcohol concentration.
- Allows for an advanced medical technician and paramedic certified by Department of Health, forensic phlebotomist, or out-of-state jurisdiction to withdraw blood for purpose of determining its alcohol or drug content.
- Provides funding for 24/7 program and ignition interlock administration.
- Increases the fee imposed on persons convicted of Driving Under the Influence, Vehicular Homicide, or Vehicular Assault.

SHB 1626 CHANGING THE DATE IN WHICH COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENTS ARE PROVIDED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Blake

(SB 5458 Senator Takko)

C 141 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Increases the time period that local government may submit a community impact statement to the Department of Corrections from 10 to 25 days when local government has concerns about the addition of a potential housing provider for offenders.

HB 1676 CONCERNING CRIMES INVOLVING A DOG GUIDE OR SERVICE ANIMAL

Prime Sponsor: Representative Sullivan

C 170 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Revises the definitions of guide dog and service animal to include those in training.

EHB 1728 PROTECTING MINORS FROM SEXUAL EXPLOITATION

Prime Sponsor: Representative Sawyer

C 114 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Provides that, in an investigation of an offense involving the sexual exploitation of children, the prosecuting attorney must use the special inquiry judge process when it is necessary to the investigation to subpoena a provider of electronic communication services or remote computing services for production of subscriber or customer records relevant to the investigation.
- Prohibits a provider of electronic communication services or remote computing services from disclosing the existence of a subpoena to the subscribers or customers whose records or information are requested or released under the subpoena.
- Requires a court to establish a special inquiry judge proceeding, if appropriate, within 72 hours after filing of a petition by a prosecuting attorney.

ESHB 1739 CONCERNING THE CRIME VICTIMS' COMPENSATION PROGRAM

Prime Sponsor: Representative Gregerson

C 235 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires the rate for medical payments under the Crime Victims' Compensation Program to be no less than the rate for comparable services under the Workers' Compensation Program.
- Requires the rate for medical payments to be reduced to no less than 70 percent of the rate for comparable services under the Workers' Compensation Program if sufficient funding is not available.
- Allows crime victim benefits for victims of vehicular assault upon the filing of charges or certification of probable cause from the prosecutor.
- Increases payment amounts or increases flexibility for the payment of burial expenses, counseling, and lost wages.

HB 1754 PRIORITIZING SEX OFFENDER TREATMENT BASED ON THE OFFENDER'S RISK TO REOFFEND

C 144 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires the Department of Corrections to prioritize access to sex offender treatment based on an offender's risk to sexually reoffend.

HB 1794 CONCERNING THE DEATH INVESTIGATIONS ACCOUNT

Prime Sponsor: Representative Klippert

(SB 5612 Senator Padden)

C 146 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Authorizes the Forensic Investigations Council to spend from the Death Investigations Account to fund a statewide case management system for coroners and medical examiners.

HB 1965 STANDARDIZING THE COLLECTION AND DISTRIBUTION OF CRIMINAL RECORDS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Lovick

(SB 5730 Senator Frockt)

C 174 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Addresses fingerprinting and palm printing requirements in the context of firearms license applications and sex offender and kidnapping offender registration.

HB 2064 **REMOVING INDUSTRIAL HEMP FROM THE SCOPE OF THE UNIFORM CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT**

Prime Sponsor: Representative Shea

C 153 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Excludes industrial hemp from the definitions of controlled substance and marijuana in the Washington Uniform Controlled Substances Act.

SB 5036 **CLARIFYING THE AUTHORITY AND PROCEDURES FOR UNIT PRICED CONTRACTING BY PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICTS**

- Provides that a public utility district may procure public works with a unit priced contract.
- Defines and clarifies bidding procedures for unit priced contracts.

SSB 5046 **PROVIDING PUBLIC NOTICES OF PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE IN A LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH**

Prime Sponsor: Senator Hasegawa

(HB 1540 Representative Santos)

C 312 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires state agencies that provide life safety information during emergencies to provide the Legislature with a copy of their current communication plan for notifying significant population segments of that information, and submit an annual report to the Legislature identifying instances when life safety information was provided in the preceding year.
- Requires local emergency management organizations to develop and implement communication plans for notifying significant population segments of life safety information during an emergency, and submit those communication plans to the Washington Military Department Emergency Management Division (WMD).
- Requires local emergency management organizations to evaluate the effectiveness of life safety communications during after-action reviews, and inform the WMD of technological challenges that limited communication efforts.
- Requires the WMD to submit a report to the Legislature each year describing emergencies where communication of life safety information was technologically infeasible, and to submit a report to the Legislature every five years containing the status of communication plans.

C 58 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Changes the date the Office of Financial Management must begin adjusting the fire commissioner compensation threshold for inflation from July 1, 2008, to January 1, 2019.

SSB 5133 CONCERNING COUNTY BOARDS OF EQUALIZATION

C 155 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Requires county boards of equalization (BOEs) to meet by July 15th or within two weeks of certification of assessment rolls, whichever is later.
- Requires BOEs to notify the taxpayer and assessor of decisions on taxpayer appeals within 45 days of a hearing.
- Removes the August 18th deadline by which county assessors must forward corrected real and personal assessment rolls to the Department of Revenue.

SSB 5138 CONCERNING METROPOLITAN PARK DISTRICTS

C 215 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Provides conditions under which a city, county, or contiguous group of cities or counties proposing or approving the formation of a metropolitan park district may limit the district's purpose and taxing powers.
- Generalizes the allowable purposes under which a metropolitan park district may contract indebtedness and extends the maximum term for general bond obligations.
- Changes board membership requirements when the governing body of a city acts in an ex officio capacity as the board of metropolitan park commissioners.
- Allows a county treasurer serving as a district's treasurer to provide a bridge loan or line of credit to a newly formed district.

SB 5187 CONCERNING COUNTY AUDITORS

C 37 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Modifies provisions governing the annual statement of capitalized assets prepared by a board of county commissioners.
- Eliminates provisions requiring board of county commissioner members to obtain approval of their compensation claims from both the board and a superior court judge.
- Provides that the clerk of the county legislative authority is responsible for advertising bid proposals for the official county newspaper.
- Removes the requirement that county election officials publish notice declaring a Regional Fire Protection Service Authority formed within 15 days after certification of election results.
- Modifies coroner record keeping requirements.
- Provides a process for filling vacancies on the board of directors of a county pollution control authority via mail.

- Removes references, procedures, and requirements that authorized a fire protection district to annex a partial city or town located in two counties.

3ESB 5517 CONCERNING RAIL DEPENDENT USES FOR PURPOSES OF THE GROWTH MANAGEMENT ACT AND RELATED DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS

(HB 1504 Representative Pike)

C 18 L 17 E3 Effective date 10/19/2017.

- Authorizes certain counties and cities to adopt development regulations allowing agricultural, forest, and mineral resources lands adjacent to railroads to be developed for freight rail dependent uses.
- Allows certain counties and cities to provide for freight rail dependent uses in the transportation element of their comprehensive plans.

SB 5543 CONCERNING A REEXAMINATION OF THE CLASSIFICATION OF LAND IN FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICTS

C 67 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Adds that a petition to appoint a board of appraisers may be signed by landowners representing 25 percent of the value of a flood control district's assessments.
- Allows the board of directors to reexamine the classification and relative benefit percentages of land when there is any subdivision, lot-line adjustment, or other change in the land use characteristics of land in the district.

C 331 L 17 Partial Veto Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Encourages jurisdictions planning under the Growth Management Act (GMA) to evaluate economic growth and adopt comprehensive plans and development regulations that promote economic development.
- Permits modifications of comprehensive plans and development regulations to increase economic development opportunities in cases of economic stagnation or deterioration.
- Provides measures for identifying economic deterioration and identifies additional policies that may be included in the economic development element of each county's comprehensive plan.
- Allows certain counties to identify policies, programs, and development opportunities to address the potential for economic deterioration and to seize economic development opportunities that may deviate from the GMA.

ESSB 5303 CONCERNING AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES MANAGEMENT

(HB 1429 Representative Chandler)

C 17 L 17 E3 Effective date 10/19/2017.*

- Provides funding for aquatic invasive species (AIS) management.
- Establishes AIS permitting requirements.

SB 5306 CONCERNING SECONDARY COMMERCIAL FISH RECEIVERS

 - Extends eligibility in the College Bound Scholarship Program to include individuals who were adopted between the ages of 14 and 18 and allows foster youth and individuals adopted between the ages of 14 and 18 to remain eligible for the scholarship if they have received a high school equivalency certificate.
 - Repeals the income eligibility rules for nonparental caregivers receiving a Temporary Assistance for Needy Families grant on behalf of a child who is living with the caregiver.
 - Creates the Child Welfare System Improvement Account in the State Treasury to be used for foster home licensing, achieving permanency for children, support and assistance to foster parents, and improving and increasing placement options.
 - Repeals the Child and Family Reinvestment Account on June 30, 2017, and transfers residual balances to the state General Fund on July 1, 2017.
 - Removes requirement that a family participating in the Family Assessment Response must sign a written agreement in order to receive services.
 - Requires DSHS, with technical consultation from the Caseload Forecast Council and associated work groups, to review the forecasts of licensed foster care to ensure all youth in licensed foster care are included in the forecast and that maintenance level costs, not including the costs associated with behavioral rehabilitation services are accurately calculated. A report detailing the findings and recommendations are due no later than December 1, 2017.
- Partial Veto:** Vetoed section:
- Requiring that the Office of the Governor, within existing appropriations, must regularly acknowledge the contributions of foster parents to the state of Washington with, at a minimum, a letter signed by the Governor.

ESSB 5898 CONCERNING ELIGIBILITY FOR PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Braun

C 21 L 17 E3 Effective date 10/19/2017.

- Suspends WorkFirst program work participation requirements for recipients who are a parent or other relative personally providing care for a child under the age of two.
- Extends a parent's eligibility for a good cause exemption for failure to participate in WorkFirst to 24 months.

SSB 5901 CONCERNING ELIGIBILITY FOR THE EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AND ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Prime Sponsor: Senator Braun

C 22 L 17 E3 Effective date 10/19/2017.

- Changes the entitlement for all children for the Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program to begin in the 2022-23 school year.

SB 5924 EXCHANGING CHARITABLE, EDUCATIONAL, PENAL, AND REFORMATORY INSTITUTIONS TRUST LANDS FOR COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE FOREST RESERVE LANDS

Prime Sponsor: Senator Fain

C 35 L 17 E3 Partial Veto Effective date 10/19/2017.

- Directs the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to exchange State Trust Land with Community and Technical College Forest Reserve land (Reserve land).
- Directs the DNR to transfer ownership of the exchanged Reserve land to the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges.

Partial Veto: Vetoed section:

- Enacting an emergency clause.

ESSB 5965 MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE 2015-2017 FISCAL BIENNIUM, MAKING CAPITAL REAPPROPRIATIONS FOR THE 2017-2019 FISCAL BIENNIUM, AND MAKING NEW APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR THE 2017-2019 FISCAL BIENNIUM

Prime Sponsor: Senator Honeyford

C 4 L 17 E3 Effective date 7/1/2017.

- Provides reappropriations of \$2.5 billion for projects funded in prior biennia appropriations.
- Adjusts the 2015-17 Capital Budget by a net decrease of \$5.8 million.

SB 5969 CONCERNING PUBLIC EMPLOYEE COLLECTIVE BARGAINING

Prime Sponsor: Senator Keiser

C 23 L 17 E3 Effective date 10/19/2017.

- Requires the Office of Financial Management to maintain a website with copies and summaries of tentative collective bargaining agreements.
- Requires the Governor or designee to convene at least six meetings of the Joint Committee on Employment Relations.

SSB 5975 ADDRESSING PAID FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE

Prime Sponsor: Senator Fain

C 5 L 17 E3 Effective date 10/19/2017.*

- Provides paid family leave of up to 12 weeks to bond after the birth or placement of a child or to care for a family member with a serious health condition.
- Provides paid medical leave of up to 12 weeks for an employee's serious health condition.
- Limits combined leave to 16 weeks in a year, plus an additional two weeks if there are pregnancy complications, for a possible total of 18 weeks. Requires a seven-day waiting period for leave, except for the birth or placement of a child.
- Provides leave for a military exigency.
- Requires an employee to work 820 hours in the qualifying period to be eligible.
- Specifies a premium of 0.4 percent of wages beginning on January 1, 2019. Premiums assessed to employers and employees vary. An employer may pay the employee's share.
- Bases benefits on an employee's wages and may be paid beginning January 1, 2020.
- Authorizes employers to operate their own equivalent voluntary plans.
- Includes special provisions for small businesses.
- Allows tribes and self-employed individuals to opt-in.

SSB 5977 CONCERNING REVENUE

Prime Sponsor: Senator Rossi

*C 37 L 17 E3 Partial Veto Effective date 10/19/2017***.*

- Creates a B&O tax exemption for wholesale sales of agricultural crop protection products, seed, and fertilizer under certain conditions.
- Extends the expiration date of a preferential business and occupation tax rate for solar energy and silicon manufacturing from 2017 to 2027.
- Extends tax preferences that support the solar silicon manufacturing industry from 2018 to 2028.
- Establishes a public utility tax and business and occupation tax credit for a utility that sells manufactured gas, natural gas, or electricity to a silicon smelter.
- Makes the provision of a pilot program that provides a tax deferral on construction and expenditure costs of up to two new manufacturing facilities an annual provision.
- Extends the sales and use tax deferral date for historical auto museum projects.
- Exempts lands removed from the open space program or the designated forestland program due to a natural disaster from payment of compensating taxes.
- Extends the motion picture and film industries tax credit an additional ten years.
- Exempts martial arts from retail sales tax and makes the activity subject to service and other B&O tax.
- Increases the tax credit limit for the Washington Main Street program.
- Creates a leasehold excise tax credit for certain major universities and provides a leasehold excise tax exemption for certain leasehold interests in facilities owned or used by community colleges or technical colleges.

Partial Veto: Vetoed sections:

- Reducing the general manufacturing business and occupation (B&O) tax rate and the processing for hire rate from 0.484 percent to 0.2904 percent over four years beginning in 2019.
- Exempting from sales and use taxes all charges for construction related to the conversion of a coal-fired electric generation facility into a natural gas-fired electric generation facility or biomass energy facility.

HB 1140 EXTENDING SURCHARGES ON COURT FILING FEES FOR DEPOSIT IN THE JUDICIAL STABILIZATION TRUST ACCOUNT TO JULY 1, 2021

(SB 5809 Senator Rivers)

C 2 L 17 E3 Effective date 7/1/2017.

- Extends the expiration date for surcharges on court filing fees that are deposited into the Judicial Stabilization Trust Account until July 1, 2021.

EHB 1201 CONCERNING THE TAXING AUTHORITY OF PUBLIC FACILITIES DISTRICTS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Stonier

(SB 5193 Senator Fain)

C 164 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows a public facilities district with at least one regional center where construction occurred before January 1, 2004, to use state-shared local sales and use tax proceeds to repay bonds issued not only for construction, but also for the expansion, rehabilitation, and improvement of regional centers.
- Extends the authorization for two state-shared local sales and use taxes for regional centers from up to 25 years to up to 40 years, assuming bonds have not yet been retired.

SHB 1526 EXEMPTING MULTIPURPOSE SENIOR CITIZEN CENTERS FROM PROPERTY TAXATION

Prime Sponsor: Representative Griffey

(SB 5783 Senator Sheldon)

C 301 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Provides a property tax exemption for qualifying multipurpose nonprofit senior centers that currently do not qualify for tax relief.

ESHB 1677 CONCERNING LOCAL GOVERNMENT INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING

Prime Sponsor: Representative Peterson

(SB 5496 Senator Rivers)

C 10 L 17 E3 Partial Veto Effective date 10/19/2017.

- Authorizes the Public Works Board (Board) to provide grants, forgivable loans, and interest rate buy-downs for certain preconstruction, construction, and emergency projects.
- Removes a requirement that the Board submit a ranked list for funding and that the Legislature fund specific projects from the ranked list.
- Specifies criteria the Board must use when prioritizing funding for projects and adds requirements related to determining loan interest rates.
- Requires an annual report regarding the prior fiscal year activities related to applications received, projects funded, and obligations of funding.
- Increases the amount of funds for preconstruction and emergency projects from 15 percent to 20 percent of appropriated amounts and sets the amount of funds for grants at 10 percent of appropriated amounts.
- Establishes a system improvement team that reports to the Board.
- Requires the Board to provide a report regarding other financing options for local government infrastructure.
- Continues the deposit of the Public Utilities Tax, the Solid Waste Tax, and 4.1 percent of the Real Estate Excise Tax into the Education Legacy Trust Account through fiscal year 2023.

Partial Veto: Vetoed section:

- Modifying the Board composition and membership, including adding four legislative members.

HB 1709 AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM SERVICE CREDIT TO THE PUBLIC SAFETY EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM DUE TO DIFFERING DEFINITIONS OF FULL-TIME

Prime Sponsor: Representative Chandler

(SB 5275 Senator Conway)

C 143 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Allows certain employees that thought they were eligible for the Public Safety Employees' Retirement System (PSERS) to transfer credit earned in the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) to the PSERS.

E2SHB 1777 CONCERNING THE FINANCING OF EARLY LEARNING FACILITIES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Kagi

(SB 5753 Senator Zeiger)

C 12 L 17 E3 Effective date 7/6/2017.

- Establishes the Early Learning Facilities Revolving Account and the Early Learning Facilities Development Account in the state treasury.
- Creates the Early Learning Facilities Grants and Loan Program for school districts and other eligible organizations to provide funds for the planning, renovation, purchase, and construction of early learning facilities.

ESHB 1809 CONCERNING TAX CREDITS FOR CLEAN ALTERNATIVE FUEL COMMERCIAL VEHICLES

Prime Sponsor: Representative Fey

C 116 L 17 Effective date 1/1/2018.

- Expands the definition of vehicles eligible for the clean alternative fuel commercial vehicle credit to include vehicles that provide commercial services and qualifying vehicles that transport passengers.
- Increases the mileage and manufacturing date limits for qualifying used commercial vehicles.
- Quintuples the credit amount allowed per vehicle.

SHB 2106 CONCERNING ELECTION YEAR RESTRICTIONS ON STATE LEGISLATORS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Koster

C 7 L 17 Effective date 3/31/2017.

- Modifies timelines relating to restrictions on the legislative use of state resources for constituent communications.
- Permits legislators up for re-election to mail two official newsletters at any time before the beginning of the candidate filing period.
- Prohibits legislators from updating official legislative websites between the candidate filing period and the date of certification of the general election.

SHB 2138 CONCERNING TAX RELIEF FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF ADAPTED HOUSING FOR DISABLED VETERANS

Prime Sponsor: Representative Kraft

C 176 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Exempts labor and materials for construction of adapted housing for disabled veterans from state sales and use taxes.
- Limits the exemption to \$2,500 for each project.
- Limits the total amount of exemptions for adapted housing to \$125,000 annually.

EHB 2163 RELATING TO REVENUE

Prime Sponsor: Representative Ormsby

C 28 L 17 E3 Effective date 7/7/2017.*

- Repeals the bottled water retail sales tax preference.
- Repeals the state tax preference for self-produced fuels.
- Requires marketplace facilitators, referrers, and their sellers to collect and remit sales or use tax, or comply with notice and reporting requirements.
- Modifies the Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Mitigation Account and payments.
- Expands the economic nexus for Business and Occupation tax.
- Changes the distribution of public utility privilege tax revenues to the state and local government from June to the first business day of July.

EHB 2190 ADDRESSING BUDGET STABILIZATION ACCOUNT TRANSFERS AND APPROPRIATIONS.

Prime Sponsor: Representative Ormsby

C 29 L 17 E3 Effective date 7/7/2017.

- Eliminates the 2015-17 transfer of extraordinary revenue growth (ERG) from the Budget Stabilization Account (BSA) to the state general fund (GFS) and increases the cap on the 2017-19 transfer of ERG from the BSA to the GFS.
- Authorizes appropriations and transfers from the BSA for pension funding stabilization, disasters, and fire mobilization and suppression.

SHB 2202 ADDRESSING THE ELIGIBILITY OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIANS FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' AND FIREFIGHTERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM PLAN 2

Prime Sponsor: Representative Manweller

C 309 L 17 Effective date 7/23/2017.

- Narrows the definition of new employees eligible for Law Enforcement Officers' and Fire Fighters' Retirement System Plan 2 (LEOFF Plan 2) membership to certain employees, including Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) that provide medical treatment at the scene of a medical emergency, or while transporting a patient to a medical facility.
- Broadens the definition of LEOFF Plan 2 "employer" to include public corporations created by a city, town, or county.
- Modifies provisions related to EMTs service credit in LEOFF Plan 2 membership earned after July 24, 2005.

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
