<p>Department of Ecology Underground Storage Tank Program – Sunset Review <i>Report: September 2018</i> Directive: ESSB 5475 (2007)</p>	<p>JLARC will conduct a sunset review of the Department of Ecology's regulatory program for underground storage tanks. Ecology operates the program under a delegation of authority from the federal Environmental Protection Agency in order to implement requirements of the federal Underground Storage Act of 2005. <p>Cost Effectiveness of Housing Approaches for Low Income Households <i>Report: December 2018</i> Directive: Operating Budget (2017)</p>	<p>JLARC is to evaluate and compare the cost efficiency of market rate housing in Washington versus publicly subsidized housing projects intended to assist low-income households.
