CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY.

An Act to amend section 59, chapter 2 of Crimes against Property, of the laws of the State of Washington as compiled and arranged by William Lair Hill, under an act of the legislature of the State of Washington, approved February 18, 1890, entitled "An act to appoint a commissioner to compile, re-arrange and annotate the laws of Washington, and to provide for publication and distribution thereof and the payment therefor."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. Section 59, chapter 2 of Crimes against Property, of the laws of the State of Washington as compiled and re-arranged by William Lair Hill, approved February 18, 1890, entitled "An act to appoint a commissioner to compile, re-arrange and annotate the laws of Washington, and to provide for publication and distribution thereof and payment therefore [therefor]" be amended so as to read as follows: Sec. 59. If any person maliciously kill, maim or disfigure any horse, cattle, dog, or other domestic animal of another, or maliciously administer poison to any such animal or animals, or expose any poisonous substance with intent that the same should be taken by it or them, . he shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding one year or by fine not exceeding \$300.
