CHAPTER CXXV.

RELIEF OF JOHN AND JOSEPH NICKLAS.

AN ACT for the relief of John Nicklas and Joseph Nicklas.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) be and Appropriation the same hereby is appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of reimbursing John Nicklas and Joseph Nicklas, for money paid to the state as rent and expended in preparing for their use and occupation certain tracts of land leased to them by the State of Washington on the 21st day of December, 1897, but which they were prevented from occupying and using by legal proceedings in the Superior Court on the ground that the state had no authority to lease said lands.

For use of certain lands.

State Auditor to draw warrant.

SEC. 2. That the State Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant for said sum upon the State Treasurer in favor of John Nicklas and Joseph Nicklas, and the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay the same out of any funds in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, in full settlement of all the claims against the State of Washington.
