TO PUNISHING MALICIOUS INJURY OR DESTRUCTION OF PERSONAL PROPERTY.

AN ACT to punish unlawful or malicious injury to or destruction of personal property and providing a penalty therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Section 1. Any person who shall unlawfully or ma-penalty. liciously injure or destroy the personal property of another shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$100.00, or shall be committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days.

CHAPTER 15.

RELATING TO OFFICIAL SEALS FOR COUNTY TREASURERS.

AN ACT relating to the matter of official seals for county treasurers and to cure defects arising from a failure to heretofore provide for such official seals, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Section 1. The county treasurer in each of the organized counties of the State of Washington, shall be by his county provided with a seal of office for the authentication of all tax deeds, papers, writing and documents required by law to be certified or authenticated by him. Such seal Wording of shall bear the device of crosskeys and the words: Official Seal Treasurer County, Washington; and an imprint of such seal, together with the certificate of the county treasurer that such seal has been regularly adopted,
