CHAPTER 1.

[S. B. No. 21.]

LEGISLATIVE EXPENSES.

AN ACT appropriating the sum of eighty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the expenses of the Eighth Legislature.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That there be and there is hereby appropri-Legislative ated out of the funds of the State of Washington, the sum of eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the expenses of the Eighth Legislature of the State of Washington.

CHAPTER 2.

[S. B. No. 20.]

FOR THE RELIEF OF MRS. JOHN R. ROGERS.

AN ACT for the relief of the widow of the late Governor of the State of Washington, His Excellency, Governor John R. Rogers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated out of Appropriation.for any moneys, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of five tuneral hundred eighty-nine 55-100 dollars, to re-imburse Mrs. John R. Rogers for the funeral expenses paid by her in connection with the funeral of her late husband, His Excellency Governor John R. Rogers, who died in office. SEC. 2. The state auditor is hereby authorized and directed to issue a warrant to Mrs. John R. Rogers for the said sum of five hundred eighty-nine 55-100 [dollars], and the State Treasurer is hereby directed to pay the sum on presentation.

CHAPTER 3.

[S. B. No. 13.]

DEFICIENCY APPROPRIATION FOR GRAIN INSPECTION DEPARTMENT.

AN ACT for the appropriation of money to defray the expenses of the Grain Inspection Department and declaring an emergency therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That there be appropriated, from the Grain Inspection Fund, five thousand (\$5,000.00) dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Grain Inspection Department for the fiscal year ending March 31st, 1903.

Emergency.

SEC. 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist for the immediate operation of this act; therefore, this act shall take effect from and after its passage and approval by the Governor.
