

## CHAPTER 107.

[H. B. 280.]

RELATING TO ELECTIONS IN SCHOOL DISTRICTS OF  
FIRST CLASS.

AN ACT relating to the elections in school districts of the first class and amending section 4669 of Remington & Ballinger's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Washington.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:*

SECTION 1. That section 4669 of Remington and Ballinger's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Washington be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: Section 4669. It shall be the duty of the board of directors to provide one or more voting places in each district: *Provided*, There shall not be more voting places in any district than the number of school houses located in such district. The board shall also appoint two judges and one clerk for each voting precinct. Both judges and clerk shall be qualified electors in the precinct for which they are appointed. Should any judge or clerk be absent at the time for opening the polls, the electors present shall appoint a legal voter to fill such vacancy.
