## CHAPTER 23.

## [S. B. 30.]

## RELATING TO SALARIES OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

AN ACT to establish and regulate the salaries of county commissioners in counties having a township organization, other than counties of the first class.

## Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That in all counties other than counties of the first class which have adopted or may hereafter adopt and put in force township organization, the compensation of county commissioners shall be and the same is hereby fixed at five dollars (\$5.00) per day for each and every day actually employed in the discharge of their duties: *Provided*, That they shall not be entitled to nor receive such per diem for more than two hundred (200) days in any one year: *And provided further*, That such county commissioners shall be entitled to all actual traveling and other necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties.
