VALIDATING COUNTY WARRANTS ISSUED FOR ARMORY SITES.

An Act to legalize and validate warrants and obligations heretofore issued or incurred by counties for the purchase of, or in payment for, armory sites.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That all warrants and obligations heretofore issued or incurred by any county in the State of Washington for the purchase of, or in payment for, any armory site upon which an armory building may have been constructed with the aid, in whole or in part, of appropriations of the legislature of the State of Washington, are hereby declared legal and valid.

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS.

An Act to redistrict and reapportion the State of Washington into five congressional districts.

[Federal apportionment, see Act of Aug. 8, 1911, 37 Stat. L.,

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

That the city of Seattle and Kitsap SECTION 1. county shall constitute the first congressional district and shall be entitled to one representative in congress of the United States.

First district.

That the counties of Clallam, Jefferson, Snohomish, Skagit, Whatcom, San Juan, Island and that portion of King county outside of Seattle, shall constitute the second congressional district and shall be entitled to one representative in congress of the United States.

Second district.

That the counties of Chehalis, Mason, Thurs- Third district. ton, Pierce, Pacific, Lewis, Wahkiakum, Cowlitz, Clarke and
