## CHAPTER 73.

## RE-APPROPRIATION OF UNEXPENDED BALANCE FOR PERMANENT HIGHWAYS.

An Act re-appropriating one million fifty thousand one hundred eighty dollars and eighteen cents (\$1,050,180.18) from the permanent highway fund to complete contracts now in force on permanent highways and for new construction and maintenance of permanent highways and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Appropriation, \$1,-050,180.18. Section 1. That the sum of one million fifty thousand one hundred eighty dollars and eighteen cents (\$1,050,-180.18), or as much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby re-appropriated from the permanent highway fund for completing work already under contract and construction on permanent highways, and for new construction on and the maintenance of permanent highways, the same being the unexpended balance of the permanent highway appropriations as shown by the state auditor's books on February 1st, 1917.

Emergency.

SEC. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate support of the state government and its existing institutions and shall take effect immediately.
