GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS.

An Act making appropriations for the payment of salaries of certain officers and employees of the state and for the operation, maintenance and other expenses of certain state institutions, departments and offices, for the purchase and improvement of land, the construction of buildings, and improvements for the various state institutions designated and mentioned, and for emergencies, and for refunds, and for sundry civil expenses of the state government, and for public assistance, and for purposes specified in certain acts of Congress, and for miscellaneous purposes, for the fiscal biennium beginning April 1, 1943, and ending March 31, 1945, except as otherwise provided, and declaring that this act shall take effect immediately.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

thereof as shall severally be found necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any of the moneys in the several funds in the state treasury hereinafter named for the payment of salaries of certain officers and employees of the state, and for the operation of certain state institutions, departments and offices, and for the purchase and improvement of land and construction of buildings, and improvements for the various state institutions, and for emergencies, and for refunds, and for sundry civil expenses of the state government, and for public assistance, and for purposes specified in certain acts of Congress, and for miscellaneous purposes herein below designated and mentioned and hereinafter expressed, for the fiscal biennium beginning April 1, 1943, and ending March 31, 1945, except as otherwise provided.

The words "capital outlay" whenever Sec. 2. used in this act, shall mean and include the purchase

The words "salaries and wages" whenever used "Salaries and Wages." in this act, shall mean and include salaries of executive officers and employees of state offices, departments and institutions, and all compensation for direct labor or personal service rendered to the state.

The word "operations" whenever used in this act, "Operations." shall mean and include necessary traveling expenses of officers and employees, and all expenses necessary for housing cost, supplies, material, services and maintenance of the various institutions, departments and offices of the state government, other than salaries and wages: Provided, That no portion of the Restriction. appropriations made hereunder shall be expended for coupon or scrip books, or other evidences of advance payment for future delivery.
