## CHAPTER 128.

DEFICIENCY APPROPRIATION—SECRETARY OF STATE.

An Act relating to state government; making a deficiency appriation for the secretary of state; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Secretary of state deficiency appropriation. Section 1. For the biennium ending March 31, 1953, there is hereby appropriated from the general fund to the secretary of state the sum of twenty-four thousand seven hundred forty-eight dollars and seventy cents for the purpose of defraying the following expenses:

Printing one million five hundred thousand copies 1952 edition, official voter's pamphlets, eighteen thousand five hundred seventy-four dollars and fifty-three cents;

Setting type and making mats for newspaper reproduction of constitutional amendments, one hundred seventy four dollars and seventeen cents; and

Operations, six thousand dollars.

Emergency.

SEC. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and for the support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately.
