## Bilingual Program Assessment

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* Eligibility
- Oral test for proficiency $\rightarrow$ Eligibility
- Annual assessment of reading and writing
- When proficient on WLPT or WASL $\rightarrow$ Not Eligible
* Accountability
- State/Federal--4, 7, 10 WASL required (new grades when available)
- Federal--Annual listening and speaking also
- State/Federal exempt--LEP students in $1^{\text {st }}$ "full year" in an American classroom

* Number of Eligible Students x $\$ 721.36$
* $\$ 721.36$ is derived through costing:
- 13.49 Extra Certificated Staff per 1,000 Students
- Associated Salaries and Benefits
