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
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### Transitional Bilingual Education

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
Purpose: Assist students with limited English skills in learning English in order to access a basic education and achieve state learning goals.





# 69,300 LEP Students Will be Served in 2003-04; LEP Students as Percent of All Students has Consistently Increased

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
Percentage is based on the total number of LEP students served and the total number of students in the state (i.e., headcounts).



### Students Served Spoke 190 Languages

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61 percent spoke Spanish; 24 percent spoke one of seven other languages – Russian, Ukrainian, Vietnamese, Korean, Somali, Tagalog, or Cambodian.

### Bilingual Program Assessment

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### Eligibility

- ▶ Oral test for proficiency → Eligibility
- Annual assessment of reading and writing
- ▶ When proficient on WLPT or WASL →Not Eligible

#### Accountability

- State/Federal--4, 7, 10 WASL required (new grades when available)
- ▶ Federal--Annual listening and speaking also
- ▶ State/Federal exempt--LEP students in 1<sup>st</sup> "full year" in an American classroom



### Bilingual Education Formula

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- ❖ Number of Eligible Students x \$721.36
- \* \$721.36 is derived through costing:
  - ▶ 13.49 Extra Certificated Staff per 1,000 Students
  - Associated Salaries and Benefits
