Opportunities

- Build on brokerages
 - Enable and direct brokers and purchasers to share rides and costs
- Create efficiencies/synergies between state agencies that purchase transportation
 - WSDOT, DSHS, OSPI, DVA, CTED, ESD
- Continue to identify costs and data
- Seamless connections between jurisdictions
- Site social service facilities with access in mind
