Report requirements

RCW 46.18.060 requires the Department of Licensing to:

- Review and approve the annual financial reports submitted by sponsoring organizations with active special license plate series and present those annual financial reports to the Joint Transportation Committee
- Report annually to the Joint Transportation Committee on the special license plate applications that were considered by DOL

Report covers previous calendar or fiscal year, depending on how organizations report. 2012 report, presented today, covers 2010/2011 fiscal year and 2011 calendar year





Overview

- There are about 227,000 special or personalized plates currently registered
- Top-three plates:
 - Personalized
 - Washington State University
 - Law Enforcement Memorial
- This report specifically covers 15 special license plates:
 plates that were created after 2003
