Incorporated: 1966 Population: 43,050


Area:

STP Grants \$8.0 M 17% Job Development Fund Grant \$8.3 M 18%

- Traffic Mitigation Varies


#### Successful Traffic Mitigation Program

# Capital Projects 2006 - Present

## **Carpenter Road Reconstruction**



### Challenges

 Obtaining funding for I-5
Seeking funds for Marvin Road Interchange (Exit 111) during this legislative session--\$72M
Final House proposal included \$29M for Marvin Road Interchange (Exit 111)
Need for efficient transportation between JB Lewis-McChord and Lacey

## Challenges

No funding mechanism for pavement preservation
Street utility

 Maintain capacity and safety at Interstate 5
2 Interchange Justification Reports (IJRs) underway Martin Way – Exit 109 Marvin Road – Exit 111
Existing 3-lane interstate is problematic
Ultimate number of lanes are not on WSDOT Highway System Plan
