
# Agriculture in Washington

- \$9.4 billion in production in 2011
- \$2.65 billion in WA Ag exports in 2010
- 2011 top crops:
  - Apples \$1.83 billion (20% of state's ag value)
  - Milk \$1.28 billion
  - Wheat \$1.14 billion
  - Potatoes \$771 million
  - Hay \$714 million

# The Big Apple

- Apples represented 20% of the value of Washington's agricultural production in 2011.
- When all tree fruit are included (apples, pears, cherries, peaches, apricots) this rises to 28%.
- The 2012 apple crop was 18% larger than in 2011, and with higher average prices, so this understates the current value.

## 2011 World Apple Production

#### **Production in Metric Tons:**

- 1. China 35,987,221
- 2. U.S. 4,272,840
- 3. India 2,891,000
- 4. Turkey 2,860,080
- 5. Poland 2,493,080
- 6. Italy 2,411,200
- 7. France 1,858,880

- China produces about half the world's apples.
- China Produced 8 times as many apples as the U.S.
- In 2012-13, China and Hong Kong imported over two million boxes of Washington apples.

## **Productivity Drives Growth**

#### **WA Apple Acreage:**

1993: 172,000 acres 2011: 167,489 acres

A 2.6 percent decrease





#### **Apple Production in the same period:**

1993: 83,088,000 boxes 2012: 128,783,000 boxes

A 55% increase

## Risk and Capital

- A WSU study released in July 2010 estimated the cost per acre of establishing a Gala orchard at \$32,281 for the first four years (before full production) and \$11,923 per acre thereafter.
- A grower must commit to and carry these costs for four years without knowing what market conditions will be when the orchard becomes fully productive.

## The Cost of Export Market Disruptions

 China, a growing market for Washington apples, is currently closed due to an ongoing trade dispute.

A 2012 study found that shifting 5,000 car lots\*
(12.5%) from export to the domestic market
would result in \$55 million in lost income to
growers and over 900 jobs lost in Washington.

<sup>\*</sup>car lot: 1,000 40-lb boxes of product

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## Summary

- Exports are driving industry growth.



## Why Exports Matter

- \$75.6 billion in goods exports in 2012
- \$7.6 billion of pass-through exports from other states
- \$23 billion in services exports
- 325,000 direct jobs supported by exports
- 95% of consumers are outside the U.S.
- 90% of exporting companies are SMEs



 WA ports handle 7% of U.S exports & WA is the 5<sup>th</sup> largest commodity exporting state (behind Texas, California, Florida and New York)

- \$47.6 billion in goods imports in 2012
- 145,000 direct jobs supported by imports
- Increased supply chain competitiveness for Washington's retailers and manufacturers
- Increased capacity for exports












#### International Tourism in Washington

- Half a million international tourists travel to WA annually
- In 2010, WA posted a 32% increase in overseas visitor volumes over 2009, the largest increase in the country, compared to an 11% national average
- International tourism accounted for \$3.6 billion of WA service exports in 2010
















#### The Role of China

 China is one of the biggest sources of our imports and our top export market...unless you remove aerospace



 China is our largest source of foreign students and the fastest growing source of international visitors (48% increase from 2010)





### Congressional District Snapshots

**District 1** – Major exporter of **medical** devices with companies like Sonosite, Philips Ultrasound, Verathon. WA exported \$875 million of medical devices and surgical instruments in 2012.



Sonosite medical device

**District 3** – Large exporter of forestry products with companies such as North Fork Timber Co, Conwood Products, etc. The district exported \$574 million of paper products and \$212.5 million of wood products in 2012.





#### Congressional District Snapshots, Cont'd

**District 4 & 5** – Major **manufacturing** exporters. In 2012 District 4 exported \$3.2 billion of manufactured goods, while District 5 exported \$2.7 billion. Companies include Wagstaff, Schweitzer Engineering, Key Technology, Nelson Irrigation.

**District 6** – Home to large **maritime and fishing industries** with companies like SAFE Boats International, Westport Shipyard, Peninsula Seafoods and Ocean Gold located there. In 2012, WA state exported over \$1 billion of seafood and \$133 million of ships and boats.
