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

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### What the Plans Have in Common


Effective plans bring governments, communities, the public and industry stakeholders together to:

- Set goals and performance targets What do we want to accomplish?
- Identify strengths and challenges In what ways are we achieving our goals?
   What obstacles are keeping us from getting there?
- Develop options What action is needed to maintain what is working well? What strategies are available to address the problems?
- Evaluate and prioritize Which strategies will most effectively achieve our goals given our limitations and strengths?

Transportation Planning Funding in the "T" Program

 Funds are invested in outcomes at the community, regional, state, tribal and federal levels

- Numerous federal and state requirements are fulfilled to ensure the flow of federal project dollars to the State
- The planning process leverages partnerships and secures non-state grant funds
