Amtrak Cascades Passenger Rail

467-mile corridor

- 300 miles in WA
- 134 miles in OR
- 33 miles in BC

One of 11 designated high-speed rail corridors eligible for federal funding.

Amtrak Cascades alignment with *Results WSDOT* Goals.

- 9 projects in pre-construction






Funding Responsibilities Changed Dramatically

Federal operating subsides reduced to \$0


Prior to Oct. 1, 2013:

After Oct. 1, 2013:

Washington pays ~ \$6 million more per year:



Ticket revenues fund the majority of our train operations – 59.5 percent.



Managing Costs and Improving Service

Outcome – Rail Division Action Plan 2014 – 2015

The Rail Division created an Action Plan to address:

- Contract costs
- Business process improvements
- Policy-level analysis
- Pilot program with travel industry



Managing Costs and Improving Service

Request for Information seeking expert opinions on cost-effectively operating passenger rail service

- RFI issued April 2014
- 13 respondents
- Interviews conducted through the summer of 2014
- Summary report, due out this fall, will identify short-term, mid-term, and long-term strategies

 - Great progress; much to be done
 - Section 209 States Working Group member
- Performance Standards
 - Performance standards/metrics/measures to monitor and improve performance
 - Incentives and penalties
- Operating Costs
