- \$3.1 Million in 2015
- \$14.67 million in future biennia

Funds are <u>not</u> codified


Who is Eligible:

Cities and counties that have adopted a complete streets <u>ordinance</u>.

Grant recipients are eligible for future grants if they have completed the work proposed in their current award.

Sample Ordinance-Wenatchee

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-24

AN ORDINANCE, adopting a Complete Streets policy for the City of Wenatchee.

WHEREAS, the City of Wenatchee is a member of the Chelan-Douglas

Transportation Council (CDTC); and

WHEREAS, the CDTC is responsible for transportation planning and

programming in the Wenatchee Metropolitan Statistical Area encompassing Chelan County and

Douglas County; and

WHEREAS, the CDTC established a Regional "Complete Streets" Policy

on April 9, 2015 by Resolution (No. 1-2015) that "encourages member cities and counties to adopt local Complete Streets policies that institutionalize the Regional Complete Streets Guiding Principles as part of their respective governmental procedures"; and Best complete streets policy in the United States in 2016, according to the National Complete Streets Coalition, <u>receiving</u> <u>a perfect score</u>.



Complete Streets 101:

What is eligible:


- City streets and county roads that provide access to all users in mind, including bicyclists, pedestrians and transit.
- Examples of approved projects include:
 - Filling sidewalk gaps;
 - Improving pedestrian crossings;
 - Adding non-motorized connections;
 - Assisting with updating non-motorized plans *RCW 47.04.320



Complete Streets 101:

How are grants awarded?

- Get nominated!
- 88 nominations available
- Based on how well a city or county supports the spirit of complete streets
- TIB staff ensures program eligibility, recommends program size
- Board adopts the program













Complete Streets Eligible Agencies
