Intent

Reduce environmental and health disparities and improve the health of all people of Washington state by implementing the recommendations of the environmental justice task force



Environmental Justice

The fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, rules, and policies.

Environmental justice includes addressing disproportionate environmental and health impacts in all laws, rules, and policies with environmental impacts by prioritizing vulnerable populations and overburdened communities, the equitable distribution of resources and benefits, and eliminating harm.

Tribal Collaboration and Consultation

Sec. 20 The Governor shall collaborate with federally recognized tribes on the selection of tribal representatives for the Council.

Sec. 18. Covered agencies shall develop a consultation framework in coordination with tribal governments and offer consultation with federally recognized Indian tribes on:

(a) Environmental justice implementation plans within the agency's strategic plan;

(b) Community engagement plans;

(c) Significant agency actions that affect federally recognized Indian tribes' rights and interests in their tribal lands.

Sec. 18 The Department of Health must offer consultation with federally recognized Indian tribes on the development of the Environmental Health Disparities map.











Risk = *Threat x Vulnerability*


Model for WA Environmental Health Disparities (EHD) Map


Washington Tracking Network






Washington Tracking Network A Source for Environmental Public Health Data




Individual indicators




Community with cumulative impact
