# **CBS** Average Award Cost

 The average cost per student can be 1 to 6 times higher depending on the sector of attendance and interplay with other aid

# **Current Appropriations**

- The 2014 supplemental includes approximately \$48.3 million for CBS awards.
- Appropriations will be adjusted at maintenance level for caseload and award amount changes.
- The full fiscal impact of the program will be realized in the 2016-17 academic year when four cohorts are enrolled.
- An additional \$25.6 million is currently estimated to be needed in the 2015-17 biennium (Total cost of \$74.0M).



# 2015-17 and 2017-19 Estimated Cost Projection

2013-15 Total	\$48.3M	Amount above prior biennium appropriation
2015-17 Total	\$74.0M	\$25.6M
2017-19 Total	\$92.3M	\$15.1M

The costs above are based on Legislative estimates and the November forecast.
