Work-based Learning: Projects

Port of Chelan County, Flip The Switch PBL

- Instructors engage with industry professionals
- 60 students engage in a 1-day PBL focusing on developing a business plan to utilize 15 acres of undeveloped land at the Port
- Students learn about the work the Port of Chelan does for our region & tour businesses
- Discover career opportunities and pathways at the area businesses/industries
- Use problem solving skills and technology while working with students from other schools facilitated by instructors

Work-based Learning: Projects

Washington State University Chelan County Extension Building Blocks for Career Readiness Internship

- 90-hour paid internship, 20 hours of classroom training
- 12 impoverished, at-risk youth working in STEM related professions of natural resource management, environmental science and recreational tourism
- Internship hosts WA Fish and Wildlife Dept, US Forest Service, Entiat Fish Hatchery, Chelan-Douglas Land Trust, Colockum Research Center, Wenatchee Repellers and others
- Projects including trail restoration, rapture nest observation, backcountry wilderness projects, GPS mapping, pygmy rabbit project and others.
