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Community Crisis Stabilization Services (CCSS)

Second Substitute Senate Bill 5459 (2011) directed changes to the Department of Social and Health Services, Division of Developmental Disabilities service system:

- No person under the age of 16 years may be admitted to receive services at a Residential Habilitation Center (RHC);
- No one under the age of 21 may be admitted to receive services at an RHC "unless no service options are available in the community;" and
- "Such admission is limited to the provision of short-term respite or crisis stabilization services."

CCSS establishes:

- A state operated, community based treatment program:
 - Short-term supports for people in crisis
 - Those who are at risk of hospitalization or institutional placement
 - Length of stay not to exceed 180 days
 - Focus on stabilization of participants in their own, family or community home



CCSS

- First site: Lakewood, Washington
 - Serve a maximum of 3 children at any time
 - Participants from across the State
- Anticipated Opening: November 2012
- Staffing
 - Program Manager
 - Attendant Counselor Manager
 - Nurse
 - Behavior Specialist
 - Behavior Technician
 - Residential Services Coordinator
 - Direct Support Professionals
 - Contracted Specialty Staff
- Future Plans 2013



CCSS Key Services

- Individualized assessment and specialty treatment.
- Collaborative treatment planning
- Assessments, as needed:
 - Nursing
 - Psychological/Behavioral
 - Psychiatric/Pharmacological
 - Other Specialty Services (Occupational and Physical Therapy, Nutrition, Environmental/Sensory, etc.)

Service Planning for:

- Functional Assessment and Positive Behavior Support Plan
- Cross Systems Crisis Plans
- Nursing Care Plan
- Occupational Therapy
- Physical Therapy
- Dietary/Nutrition
- Environmental/Sensory, etc.



CCSS Key Services

Intensive Treatment for:

- Behavior Change
- Psycho-Social Skills
- Self-Management

Transition Planning and In-Home Supports

- Staffing support by Behavior Technicians in home during transition
- Model, train, and coach family members or agency providers
- Identify barriers for implementation in the home

Program Goals

- Treat the participant and support the family.
- Involve families, their support systems, and providers in reaching successful outcomes.
- Involve DDD case managers in treatment and transition planning.
- Involve and coordinate other systems such as schools, mental health, and medical providers to create consistent, knowledgeable, and sustainable service plans around the family and provider post-CCSS treatment.
- Plan ahead for transition to home, community services, and other supports.
- Follow-up after CCSS discharge to monitor success and growth.



Eligibility

- Enrolled and eligible client of DDD.
- Voluntary agreement to services.
- **Ages 8-21** for the Lakewood program.
- Age 18+ for adult program.
- No open or pending investigations of abuse or neglect with the DSHS Children's Administration.
- In cases where clients are subject to eligibility redetermination prior to the initiation of a paid service per WAC 388-823-1010, initiation of CCSS can begin prior to the determination of continued eligibility with DDD.

Monitoring for Outcomes

Quality Assurance Reviews

- Conducted by DDD headquarters and regional staff
- Incorporated into DDD quality assurance systems

Data Collection will include:

- Participant outcomes at intervals during and after CCSS
- Participant team involvement and frequency
- Length of stays
- Demographic information about participants
- Effects of service on community resources
- Parent, guardian and provider feedback
