



E2SHB 2580 (Chapter 127, Laws of 2014) Legislative Intent

- Identify state and local policy changes
 - to foster resilience and growth in maritime and other manufacturing industries.
- Establish broad, collaborative process
 - with input from state agencies, local governments, and private sector leaders.



Task Force Members

- ▶ 12 legislative members, including three from each of the largest two caucuses in the House of Representatives and the Senate.
- One member representing the Department of Commerce, appointed by the Governor.
- Co-chairs selected from the membership, one from the House of Representatives and one from the Senate.



Task Force Objectives: To Identify-

- Maritime and manufacturing sectors of economic significance;
- Critical public infrastructure that supports these sectors;
- Barriers to maintaining and expanding these sectors;
- Resources available to local governments; and
- State policies that affect resilience and growth.




Task Force Objectives: To Promote -

- Regulatory consistency and certainty
 - in planning, permitting, and business development;
- Public/private sector cooperation
 (draw on state higher ed. institutional expertise); and
- Opportunities for employment in the maritime and manufacturing sectors.



Broad Collaborative Process

- Must consult with state agencies and local governments including:
 - Department of Commerce
 - Department of Transportation
 - Office of Regulatory Assistance
 - Workforce Training and Education Coordinating Board
 - Associate Development Organizations
- May consult with others agencies and organizations.



Task Force Advisory Committee

- Co-chairs must appoint an advisory committee.
- Composed of business, labor, and others, including but not limited to:
 - Marine terminal operators
 - Manufacturers
 - Maritime businesses
 - Local industrial councils
 - Local labor trades councils
 - Chambers of commerce



Task Force Recommendations

Joint Legislative Task Force on Economic Resilience of Maritime and Manufacturing in Washington

Must submit a short and long-term action plan for the Governor and the Legislature.

Work Plan: by December 1, 2014

▶ Final Findings: by November 1, 2015
