King County Maritime Sector Talent Pipeline Study (2013)

- Job Openings: 554 Maritime Cluster openings in King County from 2016-2021
- Highest Demand Occupations (annual job openings): Sailors and Marine Oilers; Captains, Mates and Pilots of Water Vessels; Meat, Poultry and Fish Cutters and Trimmers; Laborers and Freight, Stock, and Material Movers; and Ship Engineers
- Supply Gap: Projected labor shortage of 295 annual openings. Occupations with the three largest shortages are Sailors and Marine Oilers; Captains, Mates and Pilots of Water Vessels; and Laborers and Freight, Stock, and Material Movers
