

Juveniles Sentenced As Adults Under Exclusive Adult Jurisdiction With a Conviction for Robbery 1 CY 2007 - 2011

Weapons

There were 151 juveniles sentenced as adults with at least one conviction for Robbery 1. Of those...

- 140 (93%) juveniles had Robbery 1 as the offense with the longest sentence term (i.e. primary offense).
- 11 (7%) juveniles had another offense as their primary offense. These included:
 - Murder 1 (n=3)
 - Murder 2 (n=1)
 - Rape 1 (n=2)
 - Assault 1 (n=5)

Of the 140 juveniles with a Robbery 1 as the primary offense...

- 108 (77%) juveniles did not receive any firearm or dangerous weapon enhancement.
- 23 (16%) juveniles received only one enhancement. Of those...
 - 14 were for firearms
 - 9 were for other dangerous weapon
- 9 (6%) juveniles received two enhancements. Of those 18 enhancements (9 juveniles with 2 each)...
 - 12 were for firearms
 - 6 were for other dangerous weapon

Of the 11 juveniles with another offense as the primary offense...

- 4 (36%) juveniles did not receive any firearm or dangerous weapon enhancement.
- 2 (18%) juveniles received only one enhancement. Of those...
 - 1 was for firearms
 - 1 was for other dangerous weapon
- 3 (27%) juveniles received two enhancements. Of those 6 enhancements (3 juveniles with 2 enhancements each)...
 - 4 were for firearms
 - 2 were for other dangerous weapon
- 2 (18%) juveniles received three enhancements. Of those 6 enhancements (2 juveniles with 3 enhancements each)...
 - 3 were for firearms
 - 3 were for other dangerous weapon

Accomplices

Of the 140 juveniles with a Robbery 1 as the primary offense, 1 juvenile received an exceptional sentence for "Offense principally accomplished by another". That juvenile did not receive any enhancements. None of the remaining juveniles who received an exceptional sentence received an enhancement.

Of the 11 juveniles with another offense as the primary offense none received similar exceptional sentences.
