U.S. Compliance with WTO Ruling

- USTR announces compliance (September 24, 2012)
- WTO has established a Compliance Panel at the Request of the EU

U.S.-China Clean Energy Trade Complaints

U.S. Antidumping and Countervailing Duties on PRC Solar Panels

 Nov. 2011: AD and CVD cases initiated against imports of Chinese solar panels resulting in tariffs on Chinese imports

PRC Investigation of Six State Renewable Energy Programs

- Ohio, Massachusetts, California, and New Jersey (2) and Washington Renewable Energy Cost Recovery Program
- August 2012: MOFCOM announces final determination that all six subsidies violate WTO rules
- As of this time, no WTO case.

China Antidumping Duty and Countervailing Duties on U.S. Polysilicon

• 57% duties on REC Silicon (Moses Lake)

U.S.-China Clean Energy Trade Complaints, Cntd.

Washington Renewable Energy Cost Recovery Program

- Originally passed in 2005 (SB 5101) but amended several times.
- Incentive for businesses, consumers and local governments to generate electricity from wind power, solar power and anaerobic digesters.
- Amount of incentive paid to the producer by the utility starts at a base rate of \$0.15 per kilowatt, varying according to the technology.
- Additional incentive if equipment is produced in Washington.
- Participating utilities can claim a utility tax credit.

Background and Main Provisions

- Implemented on January 1, 1994
- US-Canada FTA Already in place (1989)
- Most of the market opening measures related to Mexico
- Eliminated almost all tariffs
- Liberalized services trade and foreign investment
- Intellectual property protection.
- Labor and environment side agreements.
- Investor-State dispute mechanism

Impact on Trade

- Canada: largest U.S. export market
- Mexico: second largest U.S. Export market
- 522% increase US Mexico trade (1993-2013)
- 200% increase US Canada trade (1993-2013
