Background

- February, 2004: Costco files federal law suit alleging 9 regulations of the state's three-tier system of beer and wine distribution violate federal anti-trust law.
- March, 2006: U.S. District court agrees with Costco, striking down 8 of the 9 challenged regulations.
- January, 2008: Following LCB appeal, the 9th
 Circuit Court of Appeals mostly reverses district
 court, finding only 2 of the challenged
 regulations in violation of federal law.

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Challenged Regulations

- 1) Uniform pricing rule
 - Breweries and wineries must offer uniform prices to distributors.
 - Distributors must offer uniform prices to retailers.
 - Prevailing party: LCB
- 2) Price posting
 - Distributors must post wholesale prices with the state.
 - Prices are publicly available after they take effect.
 - Prevailing party: Costco
- 3) Price holding
 - Posted prices must be held for 30 days.
 - Prevailing party: Costco

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Challenged Regulations

- 4) Minimum mark up
 - Selling price of a product must be at least 10% over the posted price.
 - Prevailing party: LCB
- 5) Volume discounts
 - No price discount based on volume of product purchased.
 - Prevailing party: LCB
- 6) Credit Sales
 - Distributors cannot sell beer and wine to retailers on credit.
 - Prevailing party: LCB

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Challenged Regulations

- 7) Delivered price
 - Price to retailer includes cost of delivery, even if delivery is declined.
 - Prevailing party: LCB
- 8) Central Warehousing
 - Retailers cannot store or take delivery of beer and wine at a central warehouse.
 - Prevailing party: LCB
- 9) Retail-to-Retail sales
 - Retailers cannot sell to other retailers.
 - Prevailing party: LCB

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LCB Implementation of Decision

- Uniform pricing still in effect.
- Price hold requirement is eliminated.
- Price posting (now known as price filing) changed as follows:
 - Suppliers and distributors still required to file prices, however prices will not be publicly available.
 - Changes to prices may be made at any time, with the new price to be in effect immediately.

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Recent Developments

- February, 2008: Costco files for en banc review by 9th Circuit.
- April, 2008: 9th Circuit denies Costco's request for en banc review.
- April 8, 2008: LCB implements new system for enforcing uniform pricing to comply with court ruling.
- June 30, 2008: Deadline for either party to appeal to U.S. Supreme Court.

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
