3-C	Concerning the Washington soldiers' home (DVA Request Legislation)	-Authorizes the DVA to work with public or private entities on projects to make the best use of the property and facilities at the soldiers' homesStipulates that long-term leases of soldiers' home property are subject to the requirements of RCW 43.82.010 (Acquisition, lease, and disposal of real estate for state agencies), except that leases may run for up to 75 years.

3-G	Veterans scoring criteria (Rep. Campbell)	-Changes the scoring preference for veterans who served during a period of war or armed conflict and who are receiving military retirement from five percent to 10 percent.
3-H	Military leave for public employees (Military Department request legislation)	-A public employee shall receive military leave only for the days that employee is scheduled to work.
3-1	Veterans and Overseas Voters (Secretary of State request legislation)	-Allows a military or overseas voter to return a ballot by fax or email as long as the signed declaration accompanies the ballotAllows a military or overseas voter to request to receive all future ballots by fax, email, or other electronic meansRequires the ballot instructions to explain how the voter may contact the Auditor's Office to confirm that his or her ballot was receivedClarifies that a voter may register, request a ballot, or transmit a ballot using forms and methods provided by the Department of Defense or the Election Assistance Commission.
