- Statewide (County Regional Approach)
- Housing and Services Focus
- Leverage Existing Strengths
- Support and Expand Partnerships
- Coordinated Activities linked to Local 10YP
- Establish Public and Private Commitments



Serving Homeless Veterans

Actions to Date:

- Completed second SAMHSA Policy Academy (Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration)
- Completed 1 statewide and 2 regional summits
- Completed a statewide housing inventory
- Developed Housing Finance Model
- Assisted with County Veterans' Courts
- Assisted Pierce County in receiving a \$3 million homeless prevention grant
- Assisted several Counties in receiving additional VASH vouchers

Next Steps:


- Stay engaged with USICH and State ICH

Veterans' Homes Funding History


(Dollars in Millions)
