STUDY RESUL

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- Is based on reliable and statistically valid data collected from a workload study that used random work sampling.
- Can assist decision makers in analyzing resource impacts from changes to workload and policy decisions.
- The model is one of many tools that can be used to develop a budget or make management and programmatic changes.

Recommendations to Support Future Compliance



RECOMMENDATIO

N S DOH is currently in compliance with the legislative mandate to develop a workload formula for health professions disciplinary activities.

However, JLARC's analysis supports two recommendations intended to help DOH and the pilot program's two Commissions (MQAC and NCQAC) remain in compliance in the future.

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Recommendation 1: Review and Update the Workload Models
