

#### Proposed Final Report: Unaccompanied Homeless Youth

Performance Measures & Population Estimates

#### **Legislative Auditor's Conclusion:**

Homeless youth programs need specific performance measures.

Ability to evaluate outcomes hindered by state limits on collecting personal data.

Every youth has a safe and healthy place to stay until a permanent living situation is found (draft)


### The Legislative Auditor recommends that Commerce:

- Incorporate performance measurement into grant agreements beginning in fiscal year 2018

# Legislative Auditor Recommendation: Impact of Consent Laws on Data Collection




Under Commerce, organizations report data through HMIS




# A minor cannot consent to provide personal data in HMIS

Homeless Management Information System



Without personal data, HMIS assigns an ID number to each entry, not individual youth.



Youth who re-enter programs could be double counted.

**Program entries:** 8

Youth served: ?

Youth who re-enter: 3

### The Legislative Auditor recommends that Commerce:


 Brief relevant legislative committees about how current consent law is interpreted, its effect on collecting data from homeless youth, and the potential impacts and trade-offs of collecting this data to evaluate program outcomes

# Legislative Auditor Recommendation: Guidance for Population Estimates

### Counts vary in purpose, definitions, and methods



Counts may still exclude some youth.


This is not unique to Washington.

- HUD & ED support collaboration for point-in-time counts
- ED has issued guidance
- We learned there is still confusion about the collaboration allowed

### The Legislative Auditor recommends that Commerce and OSPI:

 Issue joint guidance to counties and school districts, clarifying how they can work together to improve estimates of the unaccompanied homeless youth population
