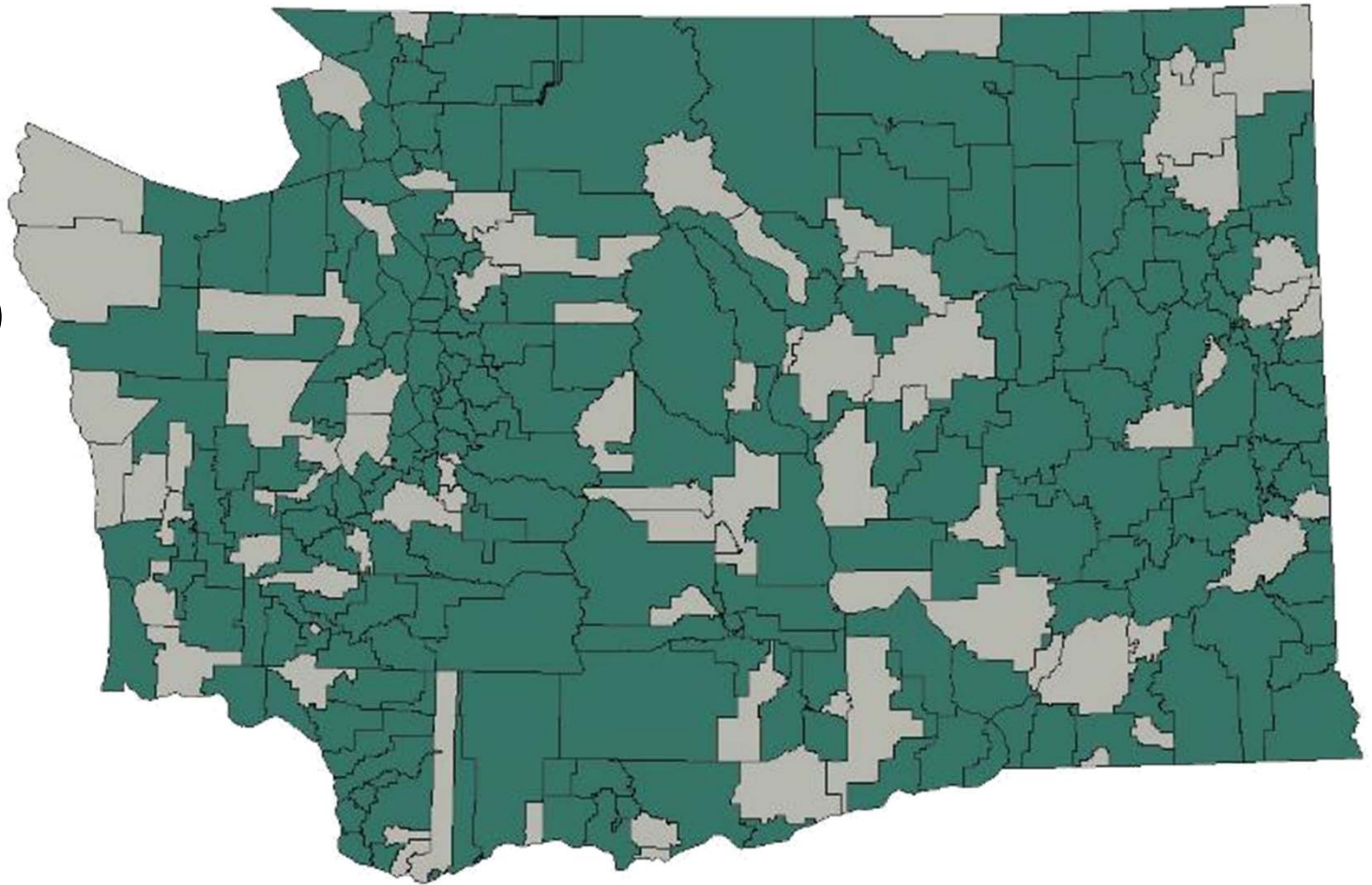


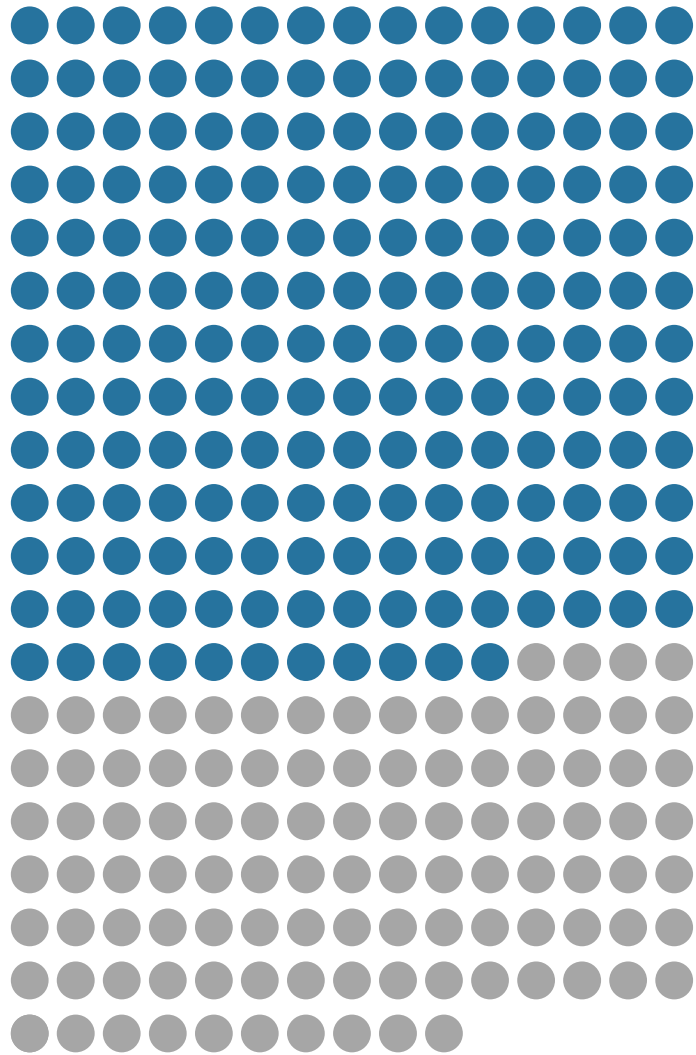

- 85% of enrolled students





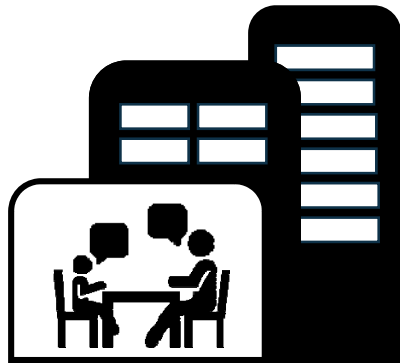

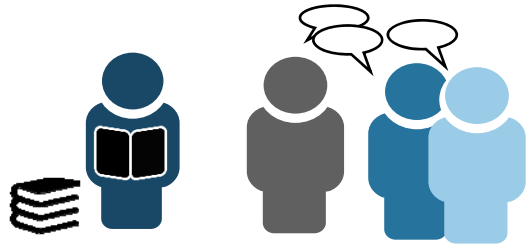

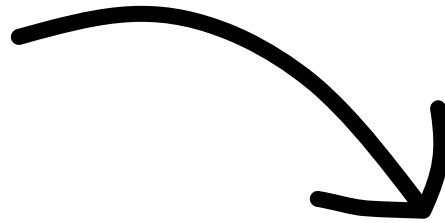

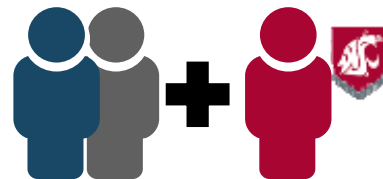
