

CHAPTER XCI.

[H. B. No. 166.]

RELIEF OF JOHN HUNTINGTON AND JOHN D. LITLE.

AN ACT for the relief of John Huntington and John D. Litle, copartners known as Huntington & Litle, and making an appropriation therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of five thousand two hundred and eighty dollars (\$5,280.00) to pay said John Huntington and John D. Litle, copartners known as Huntington & Litle, for labor, service and materials furnished to the Territory of Washington for the construction of the asylum for the insane at Medical Lake, remaining due and unpaid by the Territory of Washington.

SEC. 2. The state auditor is hereby directed to draw a warrant upon the state treasurer in favor of said Huntington & Litle, copartners, for the sum of five thousand two hundred and eighty dollars (\$5,280.00), payable out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

CHAPTER XCII.

[H. B. No. 202.]

TO APPROPRIATE MONEY TO PAY DEFICIENCIES.

AN ACT to appropriate money to pay deficiencies in appropriations for expressage, furniture for and cleaning of capitol building, and for other expenses.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That there be and is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of one thousand and eleven and $\frac{66}{100}$ dollars (\$1,011 $\frac{66}{100}$) for the payment of express charges, fuel, furniture for and cleaning capitol building, and other incidental
