DESTRUCTION OF CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS.

AN ACT relating to motor vehicles, and authorizing the director of licenses to destroy motor vehicle registrations, operators' registrations, supporting papers; and amending section 46.08.120, R.C.W.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:*

SECTION 1. Section 46.08.120, R.C.W., as derived from section 77, chapter 188, Laws of 1937, is amended to read as follows: Amendment.

The director, in his discretion, may destroy applications for vehicle licenses, copies of vehicle licenses issued, applications for vehicle operators' licenses, and copies of issued vehicle operators' licenses, after they have been on file in his office for a period of three years and certificates of title or registration or other documents, records or supporting papers, on file in his office which have been photographed or reproduced on film for a period of not less than thirty days: *Provided*, That there shall be retained and filed with the director, as a permanent record or otherwise, any records deemed necessary or convenient for use in completing the case record of any motor vehicle operator, or for any other purpose. Destruction of certain licenses, etc., authorized.
