MINIMUM COMPENSATION OF STATE EMPLOYEES.

AN ACT relating to state government; prescribing minimum compensation of certain state employees, amending section 43.03.080, R.C.W., and declaring this act shall take effect April 1, 1951.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:*

Amendment. SECTION 1. Section 43.03.080, R.C.W., as derived from section 1, chapter 139, Laws of 1937, is amended to read as follows:

Full time state employees. Each full-time employee of the state or of any office, department, or institution thereof, who has been actually employed on a full-time basis for not less than six months shall receive for his services such compensation as may be prescribed by the head of the employing office, department, or institution; but such compensation, however computed, shall be not less than one hundred and seventy-five dollars a month.

Minimum compensation.

Where compensation includes subsistence and lodging. Any such employee whose compensation includes subsistence and lodging shall receive, in addition to such maintenance, however computed, not less than one hundred and fourteen dollars per month.

Emergency. SEC. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, the support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect April 1, 1951.
