

SEC. 4. A scalp, referred to in this act, shall consist of both ears, of the seal or sea lion, connected by a strip of skin that grew between them, at least two inches wide, intact. ^{Scalp—what to consist of.}

SEC. 5. For the purpose of paying the bounties provided in this act, there is hereby appropriated the sum of five thousand dollars for the period of two years from this date, that is to say: twenty-five hundred dollars for the payment of the bounties for the year 1903 and twenty-five hundred dollars for the payment of bounties for the year 1904 out of any moneys in the fish hatchery fund in the State treasury not otherwise appropriated. ^{Appropriation.}

CHAPTER 168.

FOR THE RELIEF OF E. H. HOOVER & CO.

AN ACT appropriating money for the relief of E. H. Hoover & Co.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated out of the general fund in the State treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$158.25 for the relief of E. H. Hoover & Co. for furnishing office furniture to the State printing board for the use of the State expert printer.
